From the Desk of the Pastor

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. The Lord did not need to be baptized since as the scriptures tell us that the Lord was like us in all things but sin. That is why John the Baptist was surprised that the Lord was coming to him to be baptized. John tried to prevent him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me." Matthew 3:14-15.

The Lord sought baptism to show the importance of baptism. He was baptized to consecrate water for holy purposes. He was baptized to show us that service flows from baptism. The Lord did not begin His public ministry until after He was baptized. Then He went forth and began to teach the people and heal them.

Baptism is so important that if it is celebrated correctly, we are only baptized once in our life, because Baptism leaves its mark on us forever. The mark of the cross, the redemption of Christ. Baptism is so important, that we must be baptized before we can receive any of the other sacraments. Jesus was baptized in the river, Jordan. Today, we use water which cleanses, for baptism. As water takes the dirt off of us when we wash ourselves, water in baptism takes the dirt of original sin away from us. Our soul is made clean with God's sanctifying grace. And as the Lord began His public ministry after He was baptized, so we are given the mandate at baptism to serve others.

Baptism also gives us the promise of everlasting life. We die with Christ and we rise with Him. St. Paul says: "Are you not aware that we who are baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? Through baptism into His death, we were buried with Him, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too, might live a new life." Romans 6:3-4. Baptism is for life! Baptism gives us the promise of eternal life. That is why every Christian should know the date of their baptism! Our birthdays will come to an end because we will die. But baptism celebrates not only our life on earth with God, but also our life forever with God in the Kingdom of Heaven; and that is something to be remembered and celebrated.

Let us be appreciative of our baptism. Let us live our baptism, especially the mandate to love and serve God and neighbor! And live as children of the Light for in the waters of baptism we become children of the Light and we are told to walk as a child of the Light! Follow Jesus, the Light of the World!
