Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated the 1st and 3rd weekends of the month. Baptism class is required for first time parents.

Dear Parishioners;

This past Monday we started Ordinary Time, the 1st week of Ordinary Time. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord doubled up as the 1st Sunday in Ordinary Time. That is why we are now at the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Ordinary time is the time period around the Advent and Christmas Seasons and the Lent and Easter Seasons! The Advent and Christmas Seasons and the Lent and Easter Seasons are extraordinary time periods and seasons! That is why the rest of the Liturgical Season is also called Ordinary Time.

Even though it is Ordinary Time, the green Liturgical color for Ordinary Time, reminds us that we still should be growing in faith and in our love for God and neighbor. We especially grow in faith and in love for God and neighbor during the Advent and Christmas Seasons and during the Lent and Easter Seasons. Ordinary Time reminds us to keep growing in faith and in love of God and neighbor, because we should never stop growing in faith and in love of God and neighbor.

We will stay in Ordinary Time until we start Lent with Ash Wednesday on March 2nd. Easter is April 17th. We will resume Ordinary Time after the end of the Easter Season. The Easter Season ends on Pentecost Sunday, June 5th. We will then stay in Ordinary Time until we end it on the weekend with the Feast of Christ the King on November 20th. During the week, ordinary time will end on November 26th. Then we will start the Liturgical calendar all over again with the 1st Sunday of Advent on November 27th. (And in anticipation on Saturday evening, 11/26).

In society we mark time from January 1st to December 31st. But in the Church we mark time from the 1st Sunday of Advent to the Feast of Christ the King. May God bless our journey of faith and love during this new Liturgical Year!

(Opus Sanctorum Angelorum)

"Having spoken of the holiness of God, and the participation of creatures in that holiness, we now come to the consideration of man's proper response to God's holiness: adoration. Just as the concept of holiness is many-faceted, so also the concept of adoration. Adoration, in the first place, is creation's highest act of worship. It is giving to God what belongs to him alone, he who alone is holy. It is the supreme form of reverence, glory and honor. But adoration is also creation's attempt to reach out, with the help of God's invitation and grace, to become holy in the presence of God. So we must now consider these two aspects of adoration: as an act of reverencing God, and as a means of sanctification for creatures."

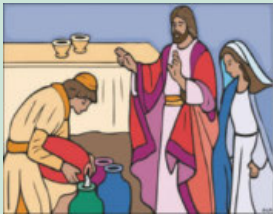

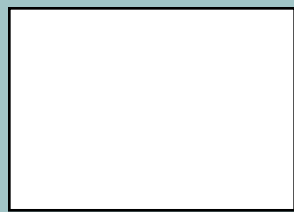
