From the Desk of the Pastor

Dear Parishioners

This weekend (January 22) marks the 49th Anniversary of the Supreme Court's Roe vs. Wade decision, taking away the laws of protecting unborn children in our country. Since that decision 62 million babies have died by abortion. America is killing its future! We do not know what positions they would have had in our country or what their role would have been!

It is very sad that 62 million babies have been killed! I am sure it grieves our Lord's heart that they were not given life, when they were made in His image and likeness!

We need to continue to be a voice for the unborn. That is what God and the Church calls us to do! We are to work and pray for the Right to Life of the unborn. Today, January 22, the annual MCCL March of Life took place at 12 noon at the Capitol with a program on the Capitol steps. People asked our political leaders to give the unborn the Right to Life. Pro-Life people of all walks of life and of all religious affiliations shared the message that both unborn children and their mothers deserve protection, support and love. They also voiced a respect for the dignity of all human beings.

Since the 1973 Roe vs. Wade decision, close to 670,000 unborn children have died by abortion in Minnesota! Are you aware of Doe vs. Gomez? That is the Minnesota State Supreme Court's decision on December 15, 1995. The court falsely claimed that the Minnesota Constitution includes a right to abortion. When the Minnesota Constitution was written and established, the political leaders did not intend at that time to kill unborn babies by abortion. The Gomez ruling requires Minnesota taxpayers to fund elective abortions through Minnesota's Medicaid Program! This is not required at the national level under Roe vs. Wade. Per MCCL, in 2019, taxpayers reimbursed abortion practitioners just over 1 million dollars for 4,463 abortions!

As you know Pro-Life people have been working to get the Supreme Court to overturn Roe vs. Wade. That would allow states to determine their own abortion laws. But in Minnesota even if Roe vs. Wade is overturned, the Doe vs. Gomez decision would still require a policy of abortion on demand in Minnesota. Pro-Life people would have to work to get the State Supreme Court to overturn its decision.

We each need to do our part in working for the Right to Life of the unborn! We can attend future Pro-Life Rallies at the Capitol, we can write to our political leaders and encourage them to work to pass Pro-Life laws, we can financially support Life Care Centers and Pro-Life Organizations, we can collect baby clothes to give support to young mothers, and we can pray for the Right to Life of the unborn. Do something! Be a voice for the unborn! That is what God expects us to do!

May God bless our Pro-Life efforts and help us to be persistent in our work for the Right to Life of the unborn!
