# HAPPY FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD!

Today's feast reminds us that God will tear the heavens open to declare how much he loves us, as he did during the baptism of Jesus. With this celebration, we bring our Christmas Season to an end. Tomorrow, we begin the season we call the Ordinary Time. If we look carefully, we can find the love of God in all things, even in the pains of life. Jesus could go on and carry out his mission in life, in good times and in bad, because he knew that the Father loves him. Jesus did not define himself by what he could do for the Father, with the fact that He is the beloved Son of God, and that is enough! As Children of God, our worth is not based on our achievements, success, or possessions but on the fact that we are beloved sons/daughters of God.

### FAITH NUGGETS (Brief Catechizes)

Holiness: At times, life presents great challenges. Through them, the Lord calls us anew to a conversion that can make his grace more evident in our lives, "in order that we may share his holiness" (Heb 12:10). At other times, we need only find a more perfect way of doing what we are already doing: "There are inspirations that tend solely to perfect in an extraordinary way the ordinary things we do in life." When Cardinal Francois-Xavier Nguyên van Thuân was imprisoned, he refused to waste time waiting for the day he would be set free. Instead, he chose "to live the present moment, filling it to the brim with love." He decided: "I will seize the occasions that present themselves every day; I will accomplish ordinary actions in an extraordinary way"" (From "Rejoice And Be Glad" para. 17)

# KC Blood Drive & Pancake Breakfast




