

The question of the use of vaccines, in general, is often a topic of public debate. Currently, we find ourselves in the middle of such a debate over the use of Covid-19 vaccines. As with any topic of debate, it is prudent for us, as Catholics, to know and understand what the Church is telling us regarding the issue.

How do we know what the Church says? There are many questions raised about the morality of using the Covid-19 vaccines. The Church takes these questions very seriously and discusses them thoroughly, in order to provide guidance for her faithful.

The moral question at the center of this debate is related to the research and production of the vaccine itself, which employed cell lines drawn from tissue obtained from two abortions that occurred in the last century.

The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF) has addressed this topic in several documents in the past several years. One of these, entitled *Dignitatis Personae*, states that in cases where cells from aborted fetuses are employed to create cell lines for use in scientific research, “there exist differing degrees of responsibility” of cooperation in evil. For example, “in organizations where cell lines of illicit origin are being utilized, the responsibility of those who make the decision to use them (drug companies) is **not** the same as that of those who have no voice (us) in such a decision.”

What does this mean? the CDF states that “When vaccines without any ethical problems are **not** made available to physicians and patients in a time of serious need (like in the current pandemic) “It is morally acceptable to receive Covid-19 vaccines that have used cell lines from aborted fetuses in their research and production process.” The CDF further states: “It must therefore be considered that, in such a case, all vaccinations recognized as clinically safe and effective can be used in good conscience with the certain knowledge that the use of such vaccines does not constitute formal cooperation with the abortion from which the cells used in production of the vaccines derive.” It is important to note however that there is a certain degree of remote cooperation involved with the use of the vaccines.

The Church is saying that the cooperation for the faithful Catholic is remote enough, and the threat of the Covid virus is grave enough, to constitute the ability of the faithful Catholic to receive the vaccines in good conscience. They also state that: “Practical reason makes evident that vaccination is not, as a rule, a moral obligation and that, therefore, it must be voluntary.”

We will be making information on the specific vaccines available in the near future. Be safe, be well, and God bless.

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

Today's Feast marks the conclusion of the Christmas Season and the beginning of Ordinary Time. It's a feast of transition from Jesus' hidden life to that of His public ministry. It also echoes the theme of the Epiphany in that the Baptism of the Lord is another manifestation announcing Jesus' divinity to all His first followers and to the disciples of John the Baptist. Some things to note about Jesus Baptism.

Jesus did not need the baptism of John. John was baptizing as a call to and sign of interior repentance. Jesus had no need to repent. But, nonetheless, He comes to John. John resists at first but Jesus insists. Why did He receive baptism?

By accepting the baptism of John, Jesus affirms all that John has said and done and affirms his sacred role of preparing the way for Jesus and for a new era of grace. Therefore, the Baptism of Jesus acts as a bridge between the Old Testament prophets (of which John was the last) and the New Testament era of grace and truth.

When Jesus entered the waters of baptism, He was not baptized by the waters, rather, His Baptism was one in which all the created waters of this world were, in a sense, "baptized" by Him. By entering into the waters, Jesus sanctified water and poured forth His grace making all water the future source of salvation.

The Baptism of Jesus was an epiphany. It was a moment of manifestation. As He emerged from the waters, "Heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from Heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.'" This manifestation of the sonship and divinity of Jesus took place in a physical, audible, and visible form so that all present would know, without question, that Jesus was the Son of the Father. Thus, His baptism is a way in which the Father introduced His Son and His Son's mission to the world.

Praying for St. Michael's seminarians and all young men and women studying for the priesthood and religious life.

St. Michaels is blessed to have two young men from our parish who are currently studying for the priesthood.

An Appetizer of Antiphons (Part 1)

Antiphons: More common than you'd expect!

I've gotten some excellent questions about antiphons (what they are, why we're using them, etc). During this period of Ordinary Time, I'd like to do a series on what the antiphons are, where they come from, and how we use them and why.

We'll start very simply by looking at the word "antiphon." Breaking down the word, we get two Greek words: "anti" (meaning "in return") and "phon" (meaning "sound"). So, literally, antiphon translates to: "a sound in return," or "sound in response." Where do we see examples of "sounds in response" during the Mass? The short answer is everywhere! The Responsorial Psalm is an example. The Prayers of the Faithful is another. We could come up with plenty more examples, anytime the same response is involved, it's a type of "antiphon."

While related but not directly derived, we can also think of an "antiphon" as a type of "anticipation." Before the Gospel is read at Mass, there is a verse of scripture that is sung, which gives us a theme, or pre-view of the Gospel reading. It helps us anticipate the Word we are about to receive. Those who pray the liturgy of the hours are familiar with antiphons as the sentence or two that is read before and after each Psalm is prayed. These antiphons give a kind of "lens" through which to pray the words of scripture. A set of spiritual reading glasses, if you will.

When God Whispers

“You don’t need to shout. My hearing works just fine.”

Are you a parent that has used that one on your kids? I’m not sure at what age they realize that the volume of their voice doesn’t correlate to the likelihood of receiving a favorable reply — it might be sometime in the teenage years, when the talking slows down altogether.

But I’ve got to admit, it would be nice if God always gave us a loud and dramatic sign when He wanted something — the booming voice and the torn-open heavens (“This is my beloved Son!”) really get the message across. Sometimes I find myself envious of the Apostles, who were able to witness such things in person.

The fact of the matter is, in the year 2021, God is more likely to speak in a whisper than in a shout. The prophet Isaiah forewarns that Christ himself will not be a noisemaker — for all his preaching, he will not cry out or shout to bring forth justice to the nations. His way is altogether different than that.

We are not the Apostles, and we do not have the privilege of seeing the Holy Spirit descend on Christ like a dove. But here’s the good news: God doesn’t need to shout. Our spiritual hearing works just fine. We just have to be listening.

Let’s wake up each morning ready to hear God’s whispers throughout the day. Let’s make a conscious effort to invite those whispers into our hearts, where they can become a catalyst for grace in this world.
