Gospel Meditation - We begin this Holy Week with the reading of the Lord's Passion from the Gospel of Matthew. It is fitting that during this week we intensely focus our minds and hearts on the steps of our Savior as He laid down His very life for us. But let us also examine the seemingly small acts of stewardship by some who encountered Jesus during this most eventful week.

One occurred when Jesus gave instructions about the room where He would celebrate the Passover. Jesus said, "Go into the city to a certain man and tell him..." 'In your house I shall celebrate the Passover with my disciples." While we do not know this man's name, we do know he agreed to this request - he shared the material gift of his home and the gift of hospitality. Because of his good stewardship, his own home became the site of the institution of the Eucharist!

There was also Simon the Cyrenian, who offered the gift of his physical strength, helping the Lord to carry His Cross. Consider, too, the actions of Joseph of Arimathea he generously shared a material gift of the tomb that was his, and he gave the gift of service to our Lord by giving Him a proper burial. Then there were the "two Marys" who gave Jesus the gift of their time. Keeping watch in tender vigil after His death, they "remained sitting there, facing the tomb."

Each of these were simple acts of good stewardship, yet God used them in mighty ways. God invites each of us, too, to cooperate with Him in small ways through the sharing of our time, talent, and material gifts. Small gifts can become mighty deeds when placed in God's service.

Episcopal Ordination of Reverend Michael John Izen April 11, 2023, Cathedral of Saint Paul, St. Paul MN On January 5, 2023, Pope Francis appointed Rev. Michael J.

Izen as auxiliary bishop of Saint Paul and Minneapolis. Father Michael John Izen, ordained May 28, 2005 by Archbishop Harry Flynn, has served in our Archdiocese as a priest for the last 17 years.

Episcopal Ordination of the Most Reverend Michael John Izen will be Tuesday, April 11, 2023 at 1:00pm at the Cathedral of Saint Paul, St. Paul MN. This ordination is open to all. 7:00pm Vespers with Bishop-elect Izen will be Monday, April 10 at Church of St. Michael, Stillwater MN.

The Ordination of a Bishop

One of the many interesting things about the ordination of a bishop is that it shows how the Church is bigger than any one parish or even any one diocese. Part of the Rite of Ordination of a Bishop is that there must be at least three bishops present - a principal consecrator and two co-consecrators. Usually there are many more than just three at an ordination.

The multiple bishops has a two-fold purpose. Firstly, the minimum of three bishops assures that the newly ordained bishop was ordained authentically and secures a connection back to the apostles and Christ Himself. The second reason is that the bishop of a diocese (and the diocese itself) is not an island or lone-ranger. The bishop and the diocese are part of a larger whole - the universal Church. The presence of multiple bishops helps to show that the bishop and diocese are connected and must be united in the Holy Faith with the larger Church; rather than believing whatever we want to believe, the Deposit of Faith connects all of the bishops together and even unites us with all other Catholic faithful the world over.

The deference we show to the bishop as the leader of the Diocese has a similar purpose. In reverence to a bishop, we recognize that it is his job to both unite us with all of the others in our Diocese and also to keep unity with the other Dioceses of the world and the pope himself.

Let's all pray for the new bishop; pray that he will be a great bishop who helps everyone become Christian, become better Christians and become fully converted to the Holy Faith.
