

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Ascension of the Lord, May 12, 2024 Acts 1:1-11/Ps 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9/Eph 1:17-23/4:1Mk 16:15-20

We often cite Jesus' quote from today's Gospel of Mark: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." This was not a suggestion from the Lord. It was quite frankly a command, and it is one which still holds for each of us. Being an evangelist, being a disciple, being a steward is not a matter of choice for those of us who are Catholic and Christian. It is something the Lord expects of us.

Often, we may like to spend time debating how to do that, but that does not lessen the fact that it is something we are supposed to do. We need to acknowledge that even the original Apostles and followers of Jesus did not do that immediately. We learn that they stayed in Jerusalem for some time, and it seemed to be only when the Church and its followers were persecuted that they began to reach out and truly share the "Good News."

Once Christians accepted that charge from the Lord, they did indeed take the Word of God to all corners of the earth. Look at the Church today. It is incredible how this Church has grown from one Man/God and a small group into what it is today. That does not, however, get us "off the hook."

As much as we may argue about how to carry out this command from Jesus, the fact remains that our very lives need to stand as a representation of what it means to be a Christian, what it means to "love one another," what it means to live and to work as a disciple of Christ.

May's Marian Feasts

The Catholic Church has dedicated numerous feast days through the year to events in the life of Mary and her various titles. The following are some of the feasts of Mary in the month of May:

May 13: <u>Our Lady of Fatima</u>, This feast commemorates the first of six apparitions of Mary to three shepherd children at Fatima in Portugal on May 13, 1917. The feast has become a cultural celebration for Portuguese Catholics around the world and is celebrated in many parishes throughout the United States, often with a procession through the streets surrounding the church.

May 13: <u>Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament</u>, Mary was called Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament by St. Peter Julian Eymard in 1868. In 1905, St. Pius X granted an indulgence to those who prayed to Our Lady of the <u>continued next column</u>.

Most Blessed Sacrament. The Vatican in 1921 designated May 13 as her feast day (but the celebration is not on the Church's universal calendar).

May 24: Mary, Help of Christians, After praying to Mary for his safe release from captivity when taken prisoner by the French, Pope Pius VII instituted this feast day in 1815. The feast venerates Mary for her intercession on behalf of those who pray to her. Many Catholics will traditionally mark this day by performing their own charitable deeds to help others in need.

May 31: Feast of the Visitation,
Originally celebrated in July, the feast
of the Visitation marks Luke's Gospel
account of Mary, having been told by
the Angel Gabriel that she would bear
the son of God, while visiting her
cousin Elizabeth. The feast, which originated in the 13th century, was transferred to its current date in 1969 after
the feast of the Queenship of Mary,
previously celebrated on May 31, was
moved to Aug. 22 to follow the feast of
the Assumption.
