PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Flock,
Happy third Sunday of Lent.

Folks, you are already almost halfway through Lent. It is flying by. When I was a kid, it felt like it went soooo sloooooowww. Now, as an adult, seeing the beauty of the season, it feels like it is going by too quickly. Now, for sure, I am looking forward to having desserts again at Easter, but the sacrifices are worth it when you think of the great value that comes from a Lent lived well.

Okay, so, I hope that I am not going to surprise you with this tidbit of information: this year has been declared the Year of St. Joseph. If that is news to you, I get an F on the Communications line of my Pastor's Report Card. (No, I do not need any of you to start figuring up my grade point average as a pastor. I am well aware that if I pass this semester, or any semester, it is merely by the grace and mercy of the Divine Principal.)

Yes, this is the Year of St. Joseph, which is incredible news for a parish, like ours, that has St. Joseph as its patron. We already knew that St. Joseph was awesome! Now we get to see the whole world celebrate this wonderful saint.

We will have several ways this year to celebrate our patron. On May 1st, we will have a morning of reflection for the men in the parish to connect with Joseph on a deeper level. In Advent, at the close of the Year of St. Joseph, we hope to have a public display of parishioner-owned Nativity Sets and images of St. Joseph. We also hope to have some sort of pilgrimage to other St. Joseph parishes in our Archdiocese later in the summer or early this fall. You will hear more about these and other possible events throughout the coming year.

Celebrating St. Joseph is not a new concept to us as a parish, though. We have had a yearly celebration that has been very dear to our parishioners and has been a great fundraiser to support those in our community who struggle to put meals on their tables.

Our St. Joseph Table festivity is one of the best in the region. People come from all around to see the Table display, buy Italian cookies and goodies made by our parishioners, and have an order of tasty pasta made by our volunteers. It is a wonderful experience each year.

This year, though, the COVID-fueled-cannot-do-things-like-we-always-have-done-bug has struck again. The dedicated St. Joseph Table committee thought long and hard about how to possibly do some sort of modified version of the fundraising event, but they eventually decided that it would be best not to do the baked goods sale and pasta luncheon. This was heartbreaking, since this wonderful affair has always helped to kick off March and our final approach to Spring.

All hope is not lost, though. This celebration is too important to our parish and too beneficial to our financially-struggling brothers and sisters for us to just completely abandon it. There is a firm hope that we will be able to have the luncheon and sale at some point later in the year, when large meal gatherings are deemed safe again. In the meantime, the committee has decided to have the display portion of the event right in the middle of our beautiful church narthex. And, instead of just putting it up for one weekend, like usual, it will remain in the narthex throughout March.

The display will have three purposes. First, it will help us all to remember to be celebrating our patron regularly throughout March and the rest of the year. Second, it will show that we are keeping our hopes up of having the lunch and sale at some point this year. Third, it will be an opportunity for all of us to make a donation to the fundraiser now. Remember, the proceeds raised from this annual shindig go to provide Hy-Vee gift cards to those in our community in need. We have lately been raising about \$14,000 each year, which provides a lot of help to a lot of people. We do not want that beneficial well to run dry, so there will be ways for you to support the St. Joseph Table at the display.

I hope that you are as excited as I am about this Year of St. Joseph. I look forward to the various ways that we will celebrate our patron and his love, example, and intercession. Please join me in supporting St. Joseph's concern for those in need by donating to the St. Joseph Table.

Dear Friends in Christ,

As a principal, I get to see many impressive things. It's always my goal to at least roll through each classroom daily, sometimes I can hit this goal, and sometimes it's a pipedream. With COVID it has been more of a challenge simply because of coverage issues, back-to-back Zoom meetings, and a few other limiting factors. However, when I do get to pop into classrooms the view is always impressive. Sometimes noisy, sometimes still. Often inquisitive and giggly. These past few weeks have been no exception. I have witnessed Lenten preparation at every grade level. Noisy students multiplying and dividing fractions, 8th graders presenting career explorations presentations, and kindergarteners blending... blending... and blending sound after sound making beautiful, simple but oh so fun words. Last Thursday I heard the most impressive thing of the entire week. I was sitting in the back of a sixth grade classroom, not too many had noticed me sneak in, when I heard a boy exclaim that Jesus was the ultimate model of the Virtue Justice, because he always gave people what they needed, which is love. So simple, but so powerful!!!

In the next few weeks, I will visit every classroom to perform spring observations. The data I will be looking for and recording is focused on the learner and the environment they are experiencing in seven different domains: Equitable Learning, High Expectations, Supportive Learning, Active Learning, Progress Monitoring, Well Managed Learning, and Digital Learning. Good teaching is important, excellent learning is the priority, helping students grow mind, body and soul is our ministry. Last week our 8th grade students re-enacted the Stations of the Cross for our entire student body during the day, and again in the evening for our parish community. I think they hit all 7 domains simply by telling the story of our Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Thank you to Mrs. Zanatta, Mr. Rottinghaus, Mrs. Reddin, and Fr. Scott for making this beautiful tradition happen, and for not backing down from our tradition of excellent Catholic Education. What a joy it is to be at St. Joseph School. We are currently enrolling for the 2021-2022 school year, feel free to call our front office anytime if you would like to learn more about how to join our vibrant community.

SOMETHING TO CHEW ON: LENT

Lent is the time set aside by the Church during which we try to rid ourselves of all things that pull us away from God. We remember and unite ourselves to the 40 days that Christ spent in the desert, the 40 years that the Israelites wandered in search of the Promised Land, and the ultimate sacrifice that Jesus gave us on the cross to redeem our souls.

We want to use this time to seek God with our whole hearts. How do we do this?

Throughout the centuries the Church, based on Jesus' preaching in the Sermon on the Mount, has practiced three forms of penance for Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. They are penance because we repent of all the ways we've put other things above God's rightful place in our lives. At the same time, we can look at them as opportunities to "create space" for love in our lives - space for us to love God and our neighbor.

Below we'll explore each of the three disciplines of Lent and how one might choose to practice them this year.



Prayer is, simply put, the turning of our minds and souls to God, who dwells in our hearts. It is a conversation with Him in which we re-center ourselves on Him and His will. We create space for Him by giving of our time to work on the most important relationship we will ever have!

Kinds of Prayer: Adoration, Thanksgiving, Contrition, Intercession and Praise.

Forms of Prayer: Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Singing/Praise and Worship, Rosary, Silence, Reading and Meditating on Scripture.

For prayerful reflection:

- When do you pray? Is prayer part of your everyday life or only in bad times?
- What do you pray for or pray about?
- Why should prayer be an important part of life?
- How could you improve/grow in your prayer life?



Fasting is the practice of giving up things (not just food!) in order to put God first. We can look at this in three ways. First, we can give up things that are not good for us; things that pull us away from God (bad habits, negative TV shows, etc.), which will help us to keep the Lord alone as our God. Second, we can give up things that aren't necessarily bad or negative. Giving up something that you like (for example, chocolate) is a way to strengthen your will. Every time we have to say no to ourselves, it should make us think of God. Finally, we can give up things in order to "offer it up" for the good of someone else. Being participants in the Communion of Saints, the Body of Christ, means that we have the opportunity to help one another toward heaven. An offering is like a deposit into a big spiritual "bank", and God can choose to pay forward the grace from our action to someone else in need!

For prayerful reflection:

- What does fasting mean to you? Do you ever fast (outside of Lent)?
- What is the number one thing keeping you from growing in a relationship with God?
- What is one way you will fast this Lent?



Almsgiving is the practice of providing for the needs of others by recognizing the ways in which one has been blessed, and becoming a blessing for others in need. We traditionally think of almsgiving to include money for the poor, which it does, and yet we need to understand it in a broader sense: any act of love done for the good of another is almsgiving. In our world today, there are material needs which can often be filled through money and/or service. However, there is also an even greater *spiritual poverty*; *people all around us are crying out for meaning and love in their lives - they need God, and we can be instruments of God's love to them. Practicing both the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy are excellent forms of almsgiving.*

For prayerful reflection:

- How are you or your family involved in serving others?
- What is one way you serve members of your family?
- What is one way you can practice almsgiving this Lent?
