



First Corinthians and the Stewardship of Social Media

"Love is patient, love is kind ..." As familiar as these words are, they never seem to stray into the territory of becoming trite or silly. At their core they communicate a truth about us and about our Creator that never fails to inspire.

But despite the fact that you've probably heard it at many weddings over time, First Corinthians isn't just for newlyweds. It wasn't written for married folks. It's for every single one of us, in every state of life and every social situation, in every country and culture and language across the globe. Which means that First Corinthians is even for the online world. It's for Facebook and Twitter and Instagram and all the other platforms I'm forgetting (there seems to be a new one every day, doesn't there?). A sense of division — whether rooted in politics, culture or anything else — is growing in our world, and it's never more obvious than when we observe interactions online. It is far easier, after all, to remember what love is when a human being of flesh and blood stands before us. When all we see is an avatar or a profile picture on a screen especially accompanied by an opinion with which we vehemently disagree even the most loving Christians can throw First Corinthians out the window. As everyday stewards we know that we are charged to be not only gracious but grateful. We receive others but we also give thanks for what they bring to us even if that's an opportunity to "strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts." So before the next time you post anything online, I suggest giving First Corinthians a read — and remember, love never fails.

OLLIS BRANDING

There have been many discussions over the last several years about the OLLIS logo. Mixing the old name with the new school name has caused quite a bit of confusion. As we moved forward with this initiative we knew it needed to be handled by experts. We hired a nationally recognized branding agency to not only create a new school logo but also design an original mascot. The branding agency's expertise has been invaluable as we navigated this strategic process. In our first meeting we discussed the importance of faith, community and school brand. We want to make sure ALL families feel connected to OLLIS while preserving our identity as a Catholic school.

The goal was to create a unique brand for OLLIS. Part of that includes the logo and mascot but the other factor is the school color palette. OLLIS currently has two color palettes which makes it seem as though we want to separate athletics from academics or that we are two different schools. Black and gold represent our sports teams and navy and red are used for our school uniforms. The branding agency strongly suggested moving towards one color palette, navy and red.

We are nearing the end of this project and are thrilled with the work created by the branding agency. We feel as though they heard and understood our needs as a school and what we want our logo to represent. Their team has been working hard to create a strong brand identity for OLLIS. The new logo and original Tiger mascot will be unveiled at the annual Pot 'O Gold fundraiser in March.

ST. BLAISE | FEBRUARY 3RD

Today in our parish we will remember the beloved bishop and martyr St. Blaise with the blessing of the throats. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life. History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.
