2nd Sunday of Advent

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." John's call to repentance and the forgiveness of sins happened in a particular time and place. But that does not mean it is limited to first century Palestine! God continues to move in our daily lives. What we hear in today's Gospel—and what we anticipate at Christmas—occurs in our daily lives. God works in concrete ways in time and space. He did that 2,000 years ago, and He continues to do so today!

Are there low points in your life, valleys to "be filled" by the love of God? Are there mountainous obstacles in your spiritual life? How can they be "made low"? Are you making decisions that have moved you away from God? This Advent season is the time for them to "be made straight and made smooth." Prepare the way in your heart for Christ today!

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

Though December has 31 days, it stands as a month that moves by very quickly. Typically this month contains some of the happiest and busiest days of the year. And while this year will be different in some ways, I trust it will still be a month that passes quickly. Fewer parties, school activities and parish events might lessen some of the usual busyness, but of course we all still have plenty to do—and celebrate.

I commend so many who have shown tremendous patience and a great willingness to help as we continue to celebrate Mass with restrictions and cleaning requirements. I know some of it is frustrating, even when knowing it's for the best. And whether you agree with most of it or not, thank you for making it work and for cooperating with what the bishop asks us to do.

I would like to highlight a couple of aspects of the Mass protocols that need review. As check-in is required before Mass, we ask that everyone attending arrive before the scheduled start. We seek to start on time out of respect for everyone in attendance, and each week there are people who register but who don't show up. So if we wait for all those registered to arrive before beginning Mass, we will never begin. So please make every effort to arrive before Mass. Once Mass begins, we need to close the doors so as to keep an accurate list of who is in attendance. I'm sorry for those who have arrived late and have been locked out, but we are following the protocols given by the diocese that facilitate accurate contact tracing.

The diocese has also asked us to depart the church when Mass is over, rather than stay and visit inside. Congregating in groups can quickly compromise social distancing and put people at risk. That is why I have been directed to refrain from visiting with people after Mass. So when Mass ends, we are to depart the church as directed. This also allows the cleaning crew to be able to do their work without delay, interruption or complication.

I know these are strange protocols to accept and adjust to, but they are the reality in our diocese these days. We are hopeful that 2021 will bring us some greater freedom from these restrictions and allow us to resume the joy of gathering unhindered as God invites. And if you continue to stay home from in-person Mass out of concern for your health, please know you have the bishop's blessing and mine as well.


We recently asked the ECC Teachers what they love about the new building. We will be sharing their responses here in the upcoming weeks.

Public Mass Information


We resumed the public celebration of Mass with necessary restrictions (<https://kcsjatholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>).

Here are some important things to note:

- We continue to limit the number of people who may attend weekend Mass to practice social distancing. Pre-registration and check-in is required.
- As instructed by the diocese, the faithful are obliged to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. **Masks will be required for EVERYONE entering the building.**
- All four Diocesan bishops in Missouri have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. **This applies to EVERYONE.**
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- **We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth.**
- For everyone's health and safety, resumption of public Mass must be slow, deliberate, and limited.
- We are celebrating 7am Daily Mass on Tuesday and Friday mornings. All Masses are held in the church and **you do not need to register to attend. Masks are required the entire time you are inside the church.**
- **Our Livestream Mass will now always be at 4:30pm on Saturday.** All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at https://bit.ly/STChurch_School

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing patience, grace and flexibility as we continue to adapt and adjust to the fluid nature of gathering for Mass in the midst of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Fr. Greg and the staff are working hard to keep this experience healthy and holy for all who choose to attend.

EmbRace Justice Ministry

An Advent Reflection by Steve Williamson

Wow, Advent is here! Already? This year is different. We are in the middle of a pandemic, anticipating its end, awaiting an effective treatment or a vaccine. Almost there, just like Christmas is almost here.

As some aspects of my life have slowed due to the virus, I have more time for reflection and prayer. I thought about Christ's teachings regarding the poor and outcast among us. Around the same time Ahmad Aubrey's murder was exposed. Then George Floyd was murdered by a police officer while onlookers took video. A cry rose up from our Black community. A cry I had previously chosen to ignore but could ignore no longer. I listened, watched and questioned. Why is there such pain, anger, grief and fear that creates so much unrest, protest and even some acts of destruction? These are questions we are exploring through the EmbRace Justice ministry.

I have learned about the large number of unarmed black men killed each year. I have learned how easy it is for me to ignore my skin color and how others are pre-judged because of theirs. The EmbRace Justice ministry was created so that we as a parish could begin to explore these issues together. We are still exploring these issues. We are working to really know our black brothers and sisters. We want to honestly share our perspective and hear about theirs.

Advent is a time to reflect, pray and anticipate. I will reflect on what I can do to help effect change. I will pray for understanding and racial justice. I anticipate getting to know our black brothers and sisters to learn how I can work to soothe the pain, calm the anger, comfort the grieving and help eliminate the fear. Advent is a perfect time for this.

After January 1, the St. Elizabeth EmbRace Justice Ministry will be joining Black Catholics from around the city for 6 sessions to discuss the book "The Color of Compromise" by Jemar Tisby. Look for more information in the bulletin.


