

The Epiphany of the Lord


Epiphany means "manifestation," or public display. The feast is usually celebrated January 6. In the US, it is celebrated on the Sunday nearest to January 6. It originates from a story unique to Matthew (2:1-12). Magi from the East come to offer homage to the newborn King, presenting him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

The song "We Three Kings" details the gifts of the Magi, but do you know what you're singing? "Born a king on Bethlehem's plan, gold I bring to crown Him again." This one is the most straightforward—gold symbolizes the Kingship of Christ. "Myrrh is mine: its bitter perfume breathes a life of gathering gloom." Myrrh is an embalming spice. Already at Christ's birth, we have the symbolic reminder of his death. "Frankincense to offer have I. Incense owns a deity nigh." In many religious traditions, incense symbolizes prayers rising to heaven. In some pagan traditions, it is thought to help "call down" the deity. The gift of frankincense symbolizes Jesus' role as the Great High Priest, sanctifying the world through his sacrifice.

From his very birth, Jesus not only manifests himself to Jews, but also to Gentiles, who are prominently included in the manifestation, symbolized by the Magi and their journey. This is the most significant aspect of the feast of Epiphany. How do you manifest Jesus to all with whom you come into contact?

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

I grew so tired of the "Journey" metaphor when I was in the seminary. Everything was a journey: prayer, vocation, life in general, were all referred to as journeys. For a time after I was ordained, I tuned out the use of that metaphor. I refused to use it and didn't listen when anyone else did. But the older I get, the more I realize how relevant and revelatory "the journey" is: planning, embarking, navigating, enduring, progressing. So much of life is contained in those words. The journey of the Magi is a response to God's invitation. It's the beginning of an encounter. It opens the door to something new. And as they are changed by the journey, Matthew tells us they departed for their country by another way. Journeys create new opportunities. Journeys transform. And journeys evolve.

As we've begun a new year, it promises to be a journey: eventful, transformative, exciting, challenging and ultimately redemptive. It was true last year too, but most of us didn't see it coming. It's amazing to look back on the journey of the past year and realize how much it has evolved, how it has changed us and how we have encountered God in new and unexpected ways. The twists and turns of the road have left us both exhausted and stronger, and we have encountered God in all of it. The journey of 2020 prepares us for 2021. Another adventure awaits, one that will most assuredly have its own share of blessings, tests and new horizons.

As Catholics we claim and cherish the example of the saints to inspire us and encourage us on the journey of our lives. Right at the start of a new year, we celebrate the Feast of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (January 4). The journey of her life was anything but easy: wife and mother, convert and widow, religious founder and teacher. She navigated some incredible twists and turns throughout her life, and she did so courageously and faithfully. What a wonderful patron she is for this community, where we prize Catholic education, cherish the vocations of marriage and religious life, invite others to join the Catholic Church, walk with parents in the daily joys and challenges of raising children, accompany the grieving with faith-filled presence and meet those in need with generosity and compassion. Her journey informs our own. And her faithfulness to each step of the way, whether pleasant or difficult, inspires us to persevere.

2021 has begun with optimism. Come what may, let us walk the journey with faith, courage, humility and hope.

An act of FIAT requires more than just a bit of blind faith. We have many examples in Sacred Scripture of people who do not hesitate to respond to God's call, no matter how intimidating that call may be! Today we look to the magi from the east, who followed a star in the night sky to the crib of the newborn King. On the way, they encountered Herod, whose reaction to Jesus was one of jealousy and fear. They also encountered the chief priests and the scribes, who were fairly indifferent to the news of Jesus' birth. Yet these wise men persisted on, keeping their gazes on the star that led them to the Holy Family, where they paid homage to the Christ child. In your own efforts to grow in discipleship you may encounter similar difficulties. There will be people who react to you with hostility, trying to steer you off course. There will be people who are completely unconcerned with your efforts. They don't interfere, but they certainly don't help. Like the magi, you must lift your eyes to heaven and trust God to guide you to the exact place He intends you to be.

Public Mass Information


We resumed the public celebration of Mass with necessary restrictions (<https://kcsjatholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>).

Here are some important things to note:

- We continue to limit the number of people who may attend weekend Mass to practice social distancing. Pre-registration and check-in is required.
- As instructed by the diocese, the faithful are obliged to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. **Masks will be required for EVERYONE entering the building.**
- All four Diocesan bishops in Missouri have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. **This applies to EVERYONE.**
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- **We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth.**
- For everyone's health and safety, resumption of public Mass must be slow, deliberate, and limited.
- We are celebrating 7am Daily Mass on Tuesday and Friday mornings. All Masses are held in the church and **you do not need to register to attend. Masks are required the entire time you are inside the church.**
- **Our Livestream Mass will now always be at 4:30pm on Saturday.** All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at https://bit.ly/STChurch_School

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing patience, grace and flexibility as we continue to adapt and adjust to the fluid nature of gathering for Mass in the midst of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Fr. Greg and the staff are working hard to keep this experience healthy and holy for all who choose to attend.


