

The Baptism of the Lord

We need history. We need it in order to understand ourselves, personally and collectively. The pieces of our histories may not have always been the most positive, honest, exemplary, dignified, proud and best moments of our lives, but they are ours. We have to acknowledge, remember, accept, and often heal them. We cannot forget them or pretend that they never existed. As horrible as the atrocities of events like Auschwitz, brutal injustices committed throughout the human journey, or personal painful experiences in our own stories, we need to remember. These times when humanity in general or people in particular have lost their way are times that need to be reconciled and redeemed.

If we lose the memories, we will make the same mistakes again. The human soul needs a strong sense of affirmation, direction, and clear purpose. Without these essentials, we will easily run amuck and repeat the sins of our past. God's voice throughout history has spoken precisely about this! We are reminded through the voices and example of many prophets and witnesses not to make the same mistakes again, come back to center, discover the purpose given to us by God, maintain a sense of proper direction, seek healing for wounds and be reconciled to our Creator.

Baptism is so incredibly important for the salvation of humankind, not only eternally but here and now. Our existence depends upon it. It gives us the affirmation we need from God by gifting us with the same intimate relationship Jesus had with the Father. We are blessed with the direction and clear purpose we need in order to be productive stewards and faithful Christians. Baptism calls us to remember, accept, and deal with the sins and inequities of our past regardless of how hurtful and serious. We consciously choose to turn away from them and put on the new life of Christ. To do this well, we must look hard and long at our sins and failings, listen to what they are saying and learn from them. If we ignore the past, collectively or personally, or pretend that it never happened, we will never grow. We will surely die.

People need to hear the message, lived and spoken, delivered by the baptized members of the Body of Christ. It is an essential message of hope that is layered with visions of justice, peace, reconciliation, redemption, blessing, and healing. It is a message that helps us remember what has gone before, the graces and the sins, and bring ourselves by God's help where we need to be. We are called to do much more than sit home behind our closed doors. We have a message to deliver. Are we ready to do so?



School Corner

Preschool and Pre-Kindergarten Registration

Registration for Preschool and Pre-Kindergarten at St. Elizabeth will begin on **Tuesday, January 19, 2021**. In order to maximize our beautiful new space and best utilize our incredible teaching staff, the following schedules will be offered for the 2021 – 2022 school year:

- **Prekindergarten** students must be **age 4 by August 1, 2021**. Prekindergarten will be full time, 5 days a week. Tuition is billed September through May—\$715 a month for STE parishioners and \$742 for non-parishioners.
- **Preschool** students must **turn 3 before December 31, 2021**. All students must be potty-trained. **Preschoolers** have the option of full time, 5 days a week. Tuition is billed September through May—\$715 a month for STE parishioners and \$742 for non-parishioners. **Preschoolers** also have 2 part-time options: Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays (\$562 a month for STE parishioners and \$584 for non-parishioners) OR Tuesdays and Thursdays (\$476 a month for STE parishioners and \$494 for non-parishioners). Tuition is billed September through May.

The registration fee is \$200 per student. Current students and siblings will have priority on registration until January 29, 2021. New students will be placed beginning February 1, 2021. Public Mass Information

We resumed the public celebration of Mass with necessary restrictions (<https://kcsj catholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>).

Here are some important things to note:

- We continue to limit the number of people who may attend weekend Mass to practice social distancing. Pre-registration and check-in is required.
- As instructed by the diocese, the faithful are obliged to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. **Masks will be required for EVERYONE entering the building.**
- All four Diocesan bishops in Missouri have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. **This applies to EVERYONE.**
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- **We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth.**
- For everyone's health and safety, resumption of public Mass must be slow, deliberate, and limited.
- We are celebrating 7am Daily Mass on Tuesday and Friday mornings. All Masses are held in the church and **you do not need to register to attend. Masks are required the entire time you are inside the church.**
- **Our Livestream Mass will now always be at 4:30pm on Saturday.** All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at https://bit.ly/STChurch_School

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing patience, grace and flexibility as we continue to adapt and adjust to the fluid nature of gathering for Mass in the midst of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Fr. Greg and the staff are working hard to keep this experience healthy and holy for all who choose to attend.


