

Ministry Spotlight: EmbRace Justice



EmbRace Justice

In the spring and summer of 2020, issues and questions surrounding racial injustice, white supremacy, institutional racism, confederate monuments, flags, protests were coming to a head. Have these and subsequent events left you feeling overwhelmed, confused, frustrated, curious, or just want to know how you can better understand these issues? Perhaps you want to explore how you may be contributing to these issues or how you can help with making productive changes in society. We have a ministry that may be of interest to you—the St. Elizabeth EmbRace Justice Ministry.

Our mission statement: *The St. Elizabeth EmbRace Justice Ministry feels called to open our ears, hearts, and minds to walk humbly with our brothers and sisters of color in living out our baptismal commitment as disciples of Jesus Christ. Our mission is to address racism through education, self-awareness, understanding, solidarity, and advocacy for racial justice.*

Utilizing Zoom technology, our focus has been on self-education, reflection and group discussion of these issues. We have organized and participated in several "action" events including prayers for racial justice, as well as active support for other organizations and churches addressing these issues. About 30 parishioners regularly join us for our Zoom meetings and activities.

We are taking a break during Lent to encourage participation in Lenten small groups. Following Easter, we will be collaborating with St. Therese Little Flower in a weekly discussion series based on the book, *The Color of Compromise* by Jemar Tisby. These will include background material as well as Zoom small group break-out discussion sessions mixing St. Elizabeth and St. Therese's parishioners. The sessions will increase understanding and help to break down barriers. We hope you will join us. An announcement will be forthcoming in the bulletin. Please RSVP to Mike McLean at mmclean@stekc.org.

We periodically organize other events and opportunities for involvement. We will post these in the bulletin as well as notify our group by e-mail. If interested in participating in the EmbRace Ministry, or if you have ideas to share as to how we as a Parish can become more involved in addressing racial justice issues, feel free to request to be added to our e-mail group by notifying Mike McLean. (We limit these messages, no robots involved.)

We also encourage you to revisit Black History this month. Not in reviewing the history of the civil rights movement of the 60's, but to read some of the recent literature regarding the Black History that many of us who are white have never explored. Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,
We have been so blessed over the past year to see the emergence of our EmbRace Justice ministry, a dedicated group of parishioners who call us as individuals, as a parish, as a church, as a city and as a nation, to recognize and confront racism, wherever it grows. I'm proud of the great work this group has done thus far and am grateful for such witness, especially as it has challenged me to look more honestly at the hidden realities of racism within and around me. Through education and conversation, through prayer and public witness, this ministry has already built relationships across racial and denominational lines, and thus is such good news for our world.

The group has established this as a Mission Statement: "The St. Elizabeth EmbRace Justice Ministry feels called to open our ears, hearts and minds to walk humbly with our brothers and sisters of color in living out our baptismal commitment as disciples of Jesus Christ. Our mission is to address racism through education, self-awareness, understanding, solidarity and advocacy for racial justice."

Hearing a call to "walk humbly" is good news, as I think there's a great temptation these days to walk less than humbly: to be more eager to speak than listen, to teach more than learn, and to justify than repent. Walking humbly is always difficult, but especially when the world feels divided, hostile and full of unknowns. But it's the path of faith and the path of hope to recognize our need to listen, to learn and to repent, and to model that dynamic for others, so as to expose and heal the brokenness of the human family.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a similar call in their recent Pastoral Letter on racism, *Open Wide Our Hearts*: "What is needed, and what we are calling for, is a genuine conversion of heart, a conversion that will compel change, and the reform of our institutions and society. Conversion is a long road to travel for the individual. Moving our nation to a full realization of the promise of liberty, equality, and justice for all is even more challenging. However, in Christ we can find the strength and the grace necessary to make that journey."

Our Catholic Social Teaching proclaims the life and dignity of every human person, and calls us to stand in solidarity with any who suffer the effects of racism or any kind of prejudice. This social teaching, founded on the principle of the Common Good, teaches us what is best for the human family, as God has revealed it, in Scripture and our Tradition. I'm excited and proud that our EmbRace Justice group is so passionately dedicated to this, and call us to walk humbly with them on the journey to a more just and peaceful world.

Jesus gives us an incredible example of fiat in today's gospel. He serves us without counting the cost. May we all do the same in turn.

Public Mass Information


We resumed the public celebration of Mass with necessary restrictions (<https://kcsj catholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>).

Here are some important things to note:

- We continue to limit the number of people who may attend weekend Mass to practice social distancing. Pre-registration and check-in is required.
- As instructed by the diocese, the faithful are obliged to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. **Masks will be required for EVERYONE entering the building.**
- All four Diocesan bishops in Missouri have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. **This applies to EVERYONE.**
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- **We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth.**
- For everyone's health and safety, resumption of public Mass must be slow, deliberate, and limited.
- We are celebrating 7am Daily Mass on Tuesday and Friday mornings. All Masses are held in the church and **you do not need to register to attend. Masks are required the entire time you are inside the church.**
- **Our Livestream Mass will now always be at 4:30pm on Saturday.** All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at https://bit.ly/STChurch_School

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing patience, grace and flexibility as we continue to adapt and adjust to the fluid nature of gathering for Mass in the midst of the COVID-19 public health emergency. 
Social Services Notes
