

## Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

We have been uniquely prepared for Lent this year. The journey of the last 12 months has been a true journey into the desert. From the sudden experience of sheltering in place and the interruption of life last March (which has continued for many of us to the present day), to the slow return for some of us to some kind of life outside the home, we have indeed found ourselves in the desert. Symbolically, the desert represents a place of both testing and revelation in our tradition, an experience of challenge and clarity, where we might well suffer, but where we also might discover deeper and more life-giving truth. The desert is foreboding, but it is also the best place to learn more about ourselves, and how to live in right relationship with God and neighbor.

Ash Wednesday inaugurates a new Lenten desert journey for us. Throughout the season, the staff and I invite you to connect to this present foray into the desert by returning to "The Desert of the Past Year," our experience of most of 2020. Through Sunday homilies and a reflection question, we ask you to ponder and share your own experience of how the desert has tested and purified, challenged and strengthened, you and your family. In light of the homily each week, I will offer a specific question for reflection and response. We will invite you to submit your responses to that question by a short video, phone conversation or written message, and each week, we will compile those responses in a video collection posted on YouTube. It will be a great way to collect the wisdom and experience of this community, and stay connected to each other in spite of continuing distance. In a parish like St. Elizabeth, both of those are so precious and important to us: the bonds of this parish family, and the wisdom dwelling here so fully and richly.

We will offer more specific instruction as we go, but in preparation for Lent this year, I invite you to start reflecting on The Desert of the Past Year. Flip back through the calendar or your journal. Revisit the list of books you've read or special projects you've accomplished. Think about the new things you've learned to do or all that you've had to give up. Pull up old parish bulletins on our website and revisit those times. Consider the new vocabulary you've developed, such as "Zoom" and "Virtual Learning," for example, or how familiar words like "Quarantine" and "Mask" have become more commonplace. Make a list of new family traditions or positive experiences that happened because of being at home together more.

We have had a unique and intense experience of the desert over the past year, and in some ways, it continues. And many of us have been surprised at the blessings that have emerged in the midst of the suffering. It is so often how our faith takes shape and deepens, through this strange and central mystery of dying and rising. We are going to dig into that mystery together this Lent so as to see what God has been up to in the shadows and the light. I am really looking forward to this!



## Parish News & Notes

### Public Mass Information

We resumed the public celebration of Mass with necessary restrictions (<https://kcsjccatholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>).

Here are some important things to note:

- We continue to limit the number of people who may attend weekend Mass to practice social distancing. Pre-registration and check-in is required.
- As instructed by the diocese, the faithful are obliged to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. **Masks will be required for EVERYONE entering the building.**
- All four Diocesan bishops in Missouri have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. **This applies to EVERYONE.**
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- **We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth.**
- For everyone's health and safety, resumption of public Mass must be slow, deliberate, and limited.
- We are celebrating 7am Daily Mass on Tuesday and Friday mornings. All Masses are held in the church and **you do not need to register to attend. Masks are required the entire time you are inside the church.**
- **Our Livestream Mass will now always be at 4:30pm on Saturday.** All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at [https://bit.ly/STEChurch\\_School](https://bit.ly/STEChurch_School)

### Ash Wednesday Services

Many things will be different this year for our Lenten Season, beginning with Ash Wednesday. A large number of people attend this service to begin the season in prayer and petition for a productive time of conversion.



On February 17th, we will celebrate two parish Masses (7:00 am and 6:00 pm with distribution of ashes), and one Liturgy of the Word service (12:00 pm Noon, presided by a lay person, with distribution of ashes). **Continued limited occupancy requires you sign up to attend any of these services, following the protocol for weekend Masses.**

Our Bishop has asked us to follow an alternate method for imposition of ashes. This method is practiced in many countries around the world. Please visit our website for more information and to sign up.
