

## 2nd Sunday of Lent

## Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,


The day after Ash Wednesday, I told the Assembly at Daily Mass how good I felt about Lent this year, that it was good timing and that I had made resolutions that already were ringing true with my needs and experience. Later that day, a parishioner told me the same thing, that he felt like the resolutions he'd made were the right ones and were already bearing good fruit. I was really glad to hear it. It made me think we're all in the same boat.

It feels so good to recognize how God is guiding us, how we are often shepherded along the right path by divine wisdom, grace and inspiration. I have the feeling a lot of us are experiencing it this year, that Lent is coming along at a good time as we seek to return to the regular practice of faith by attending Mass in person and by finding our way back to some kind of rhythm and routine of faith, albeit with new vitality and perspective.

God tells Peter, James and John to listen to Jesus as they witness his transfiguration on the mountaintop. Jesus has words, wisdom and power to guide them and shepherd them. And his words take shape in the mystery of his death and resurrection. As God charges Peter, James, and John to listen to Jesus, God invites us to do the same. To pay attention to his story. To see where his life leads him. To recognize in a death freely accepted that new life follows.

I believe many of our resolutions have been inspired, suggested and directed by Jesus. He has offered a life-giving word to us, and we have done what the Father has commanded: we have listened to him. I think it's worth asking ourselves to remember other times in the past year we have heard the words of Jesus and have listened to him. In the desert of the past year, what words of Jesus have given you hope?

### Public Mass Information


We resumed the public celebration of Mass with necessary restrictions (<https://kcsjatholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>).

Here are some important things to note:

- We continue to limit the number of people who may attend weekend Mass to practice social distancing. Pre-registration and check-in is required.
- As instructed by the diocese, the faithful are obliged to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. **Masks will be required for EVERYONE entering the building.**
- All four Diocesan bishops in Missouri have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. **This applies to EVERYONE.**
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- **We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth.**
- For everyone's health and safety, resumption of public Mass must be slow, deliberate, and limited.
- We are celebrating **7am Daily Mass Tuesday – Friday** mornings. All Masses are held in the church and **you do not need to register to attend. Masks are required the entire time you are inside the church.**
- **Our Livestream Mass will now always be at 4:30pm on Saturday.** All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at [https://bit.ly/STChurch\\_School](https://bit.ly/STChurch_School)

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing patience, grace and flexibility as we continue to adapt and adjust to the fluid nature of gathering for Mass in the midst of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Fr. Greg and the staff are working hard to keep this experience healthy and holy for all who choose to attend.



For the past 11 months, spotty internet connectivity has made remote learning challenging for students in the Romero Community.



All of us exercise power...personal, social, economic, religious, political, etc. As Christians, we're called to understand power in a particular way, to exercise it in light of the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, and to work to overcome abuses of power in our world.
