

3rd Sunday of Lent

With our world in such constant turmoil and conflict, it makes such good sense to return to the simple directives given in the Ten Commandments. God's unassuming guidelines provide the perfect recipe for ordering our relationships with God, others, and even ourselves.

But yet, we are so quick to glance beyond them and even remove them from public view because we foolishly believe we can create something better. Arrogance runs far deeper in the members of our society than we can ever imagine. Lent is a perfect time to call ourselves back to our foundations and the basic relationships that comprise our lives. It is also a time to remember that Jesus is the true sign of God's presence. Everything he says and does, including his suffering and death, is a sign of the God who sent him. The anger we witness when Jesus exhorts those in the temple to stop making his Father's house a marketplace can equally be seen in his anger and frustration over humanity's constant mission to turn God's creation into a secular world. We have a lot of work to do for sure.

Stewardship

The cleansing of the temple shows Jesus in a moment of righteous anger—not something we see very often. He sees people bartering over mere pennies, animals being bought for sacrifice, and people milling about in a space designated for prayer and worship. This all seems foreign to us, as our churches do not resemble this chaotic scene. Or do they? Are we good stewards of our space? Jesus was angered at the lack of reverence in His Father's house. Do we struggle with this in our own church? Do we approach the sanctuary in awe, knowing that God is present there? Jesus taught that animal sacrifices were not necessary, yet the people continued to try and outdo each other with their offerings. What about your offering? Is it a gift of self, coming from a loving heart? Jesus wanted the temple to be a place of worship for ALL people, yet there were divisions that segregated particular groups to particular areas. Is there anything about your parish that keeps the seeking stranger from finding God? Is it a welcoming place? Are you welcoming? We must not be so arrogant as to think we are better than those we read about in today's gospel. Instead, we should strive to be perfect stewards of the time and space that God has given us.

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

Years ago, I remember a teacher saying that the standard of Biblical Justice is to be in right relationship with God and neighbor. She said that the Scriptures hold that as the standard for justice, that we continually seek to be right with God and right with neighbor. I love that approach to justice, especially because it's a standard that's never complete. We can't get to the end of a day, week, month or year and say, "I did it. All the boxes are checked and my duty is done." If we are called to be in right relationship, our faith becomes a dynamic way of life rather than a static end in itself.

I think that's really important in a world that continually changes. It honors the real experience of being human. To recognize that God lives and moves in our lives in new and surprising ways, to appreciate the ever-evolving experience of being human on this earth, to acknowledge that life is a journey with ever-expanding richness and challenge, is to make our faith a living, dynamic reality. It places faith in the midst of the messy and the perfect, the dull and the exciting, the questions and the resolutions. It's the kind of faith that becomes incarnate, real and life-changing.

Over the past year, our experience has presented incredible challenges and opportunities to relate to God and neighbor in new ways. More solitude and quiet have given us opportunities to pray. Precious togetherness with family and neighbors has opened our eyes to the gift of one another. And on the other side of it, loss, impatience and upheaval in schedules and plans might well have tested relationships with God and neighbor. The content of our hearts and minds, both the goodness and darkness within, might all have become more real to us in the past year.

As much as there might be to sort through in it all, the past twelve months have revealed things, changed things, and enlivened things. There is much to see, savor, and learn in it all. In the desert of the past year, what has drawn you into right relationship with God and neighbor?

Public Mass Information

We resumed the public celebration of Mass with necessary restrictions (<https://kcsjatholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>).

Here are some important things to note:

- We continue to limit the number of people who may attend weekend Mass to practice social distancing. Pre-registration and check-in is required.
- As instructed by the diocese, the faithful are obliged to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. **Masks will be required for EVERYONE entering the building.**
- All four Diocesan bishops in Missouri have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. **This applies to EVERYONE.**
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- **We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth.**
- For everyone's health and safety, resumption of public Mass must be slow, deliberate, and limited.
- We are celebrating **7am Daily Mass Tuesday – Friday** mornings. All Masses are held in the church and **you do not need to register to attend. Masks are required the entire time you are inside the church.**
- **Our Livestream Mass will now always be at 4:30pm on Saturday.** All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at https://bit.ly/STChurch_School

Mass procedures and guidelines, including mask usage and communion distribution, plus registration links can be found on our website at www.stekc.org.

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing patience, grace and flexibility as we continue to adapt and adjust to the fluid nature of gathering for Mass in the midst of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Fr. Greg and the staff are working hard to keep this experience healthy and holy for all who choose to attend.


