## 5th Sunday of Lent

How do we convince people that God's law is written upon their hearts? God is wedded to God's people. This is a simple and fundamental fact of life. Yet, many ignore this truth and carry on as if they, or humanity as a whole, are the center of the universe. As a grain of wheat has to fall to the ground and die in order to become what it really is, we too must die to our secular images and ideas of ourselves so that we can become who God really made us to be. If all of us kept our focus on God's deep bonded love with human beings, indeed with our very self, then there would be no need to teach others this fundamental life lesson. They would simply know this truth, as Jeremiah tells us.

Somehow, perhaps through original and personal sin, we have lost sight of this reality. We have lost our way and our axis. It is time to find our way back, to learn the virtue of obedience, to pay attention to what God is saying and become aware of the Divine Love that is the reason for all creation. Then, even in our darkest hour when all may seem to be lost, we can say as did Jesus, the model of obedience, "Father, glorify your name," By this perseverance, people can come to know the Lord and what God has done.

## Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

I heard once years ago that for an adult to remember something, we have to hear it seven times. At the time, that sounded like a lot. Seven times repeated before we remember something? I'd think three or four times would do it. But it was seven times.

These days, I realize how true that is, and honestly, how it might be an underestimate! There are things I have heard many times more than seven, and yet I struggle to remember them. There are things I've said more than seven times, and yet people say, "I've never heard that before." It leads me to wonder whether we really know how many times something must be repeated before we remember it. Maybe there's no magic number. Maybe it's more about the quality and intensity of the experience.

The past year has called us all to surrender a lot: certain freedoms, ways of living, travel, large gatherings at holidays, concerts, Mass in a church full of people. We've had to give up a lot. And as Catholic Christians, we believe surrender can be a holy and redemptive experience, that it can immerse us in the rich waters of grace and divine life. So as tough as the last year has been, it has given us many opportunities to live the central mystery of our faith: that every death is followed by some kind of new life.

What I love pondering is that we have experienced this many, many times in the past year, far more than seven times! We have lived this mystery every day, enough that it might actually have taken flesh in us without our even knowing it. The story of surrender, the grain of wheat that "falls to the ground and dies," has unfolded day by day, maybe even hour by hour. Maybe we have lived it so faithfully that it has become a part of us. In the desert of the past year, what has God written upon your heart?

## Parish News & Notes

### Public Mass Information

We resumed the public celebration of Mass with necessary restrictions (<https://kcsjatholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>).

Here are some important things to note:

- We continue to limit the number of people who may attend weekend Mass to practice social distancing. Pre-registration and check-in is required.
- As instructed by the diocese, the faithful are obliged to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. **Masks will be required for EVERYONE entering the building.**
- All four Diocesan bishops in Missouri have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. **This applies to EVERYONE.**
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- **We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth.**
- For everyone's health and safety, resumption of public Mass must be slow, deliberate, and limited.
- We are celebrating **7am Daily Mass Tuesday – Friday** mornings. All Masses are held in the church and **you do not need to register to attend. Masks are required the entire time you are inside the church.**
- **Our Livestream Mass will now always be at 4:30pm on Saturday.** All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at [https://bit.ly/STChurch\\_School](https://bit.ly/STChurch_School)

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing patience, grace and flexibility as we continue to adapt and adjust to the fluid nature of gathering for Mass in the midst of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Fr. Greg and the staff are working hard to keep this experience healthy and holy for all who choose to attend.

Evangelium Vitae, written by St. John Paul II, was given in Rome on March 25, 1995, in order to coincide with the Annunciation.
