Palm Sunday

What an ironic twist of events! Jesus is hailed with palm branches as he comes down a street one minute and faces agonizing suffering and death on a cross the next. Does any of this make any sense? They shouted, "hosanna to our King," out of one side of their mouths and, "crucify him," out of the other. At first glance it seems like such hypocrisy. Yet, when we step back there may be more truth to the story than we care to admit. We struggle with Jesus. We hail him in our churches but struggle to figure out what to do with him on our streets. We are fine when we hear pious renderings of his messages and preaching but wince when it gets to the part about changing the way we conduct business and becoming more sensitive to the disadvantaged, poor and marginalized. We invoke God's name when we want victory and keep silence when it comes to global solidarity. We talk out of both sides of our mouths too, looking only to what works or suits us at the time and leaving the rest. There exists in each one of us a person who hails our King with hosannas and a person who is all too willing to choose Jesus over Barabbas for the cross. Something to think about this Holy Week!

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

Suffering is rarely for just an instant. Most of our experiences of suffering last longer than a moment. That's what makes it challenging. If it were a quick experience, if it only flashed in and out of our story on occasion, it would be a much less dreaded experience. But as I think about suffering, it is usually more of a journey, a reality to be lived, a dynamic to be negotiated. It might be an hour-long conversation that's filled with conflict, it might be an event that leaves us bored or restless, it might be an illness that will affect us for the rest of our lives, or a death that changes everything. Suffering is more than just a momentary experience. It is usually a journey that requires acceptance, endurance and trust.

Of course the desert of the past year has been marked by suffering. As I wrote last week, we've all had to give up a lot. And most of it hasn't gone away quickly. We've had our losses and restrictions, our disappointments and frustrations. There has been abundant conflict and even hostility on occasion. We've all had to come to a place of acceptance. We've all had to endure difficulty. We've all hopefully learned a new quality of trust.

Jesus' journey to the Cross isn't a quick one. As his public ministry progresses, it puts him at odds with many powerful people. I'm sure his awareness of what is coming is a heavy burden to bear before it even happens. And the story of his Passion is clearly a journey of suffering. It's not quick or momentary, but is a stretch of time, a succession of hours marked by pain, betrayal and brokenness that he chooses to endure. The Passion proclaims a divine resolve to enter fully into the human experience of suffering, to remain in it and be broken by it, with a hope that it will bear fruit.

This is the mystery we live, the Paschal Mystery. It's not just a passing moment or occasion, but a way of life, a way of entering and negotiating the inevitable suffering of life. We've had a lot of practice at this mystery over the last twelve months. In the desert of the past year, how has your faith helped you endure suffering?

Public Mass Information

We resumed the public celebration of Mass with necessary restrictions (<https://kcsjatholic.org/coronavirus-updates/liturgical-guidelines/>).

Here are some important things to note:

- We continue to limit the number of people who may attend weekend Mass to practice social distancing. Pre-registration and check-in is required.
- As instructed by the diocese, the faithful are obliged to wear a mask the entire time you are inside the church. **Masks will be required for EVERYONE entering the building.**
- All four Diocesan bishops in Missouri have dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. **This applies to EVERYONE.**
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- **We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth.**
- For everyone's health and safety, resumption of public Mass must be slow, deliberate, and limited.
- We are celebrating **7am Daily Mass Tuesday – Friday** mornings. All Masses are held in the church and **you do not need to register to attend. Masks are required the entire time you are inside the church.**
- **Our Livestream Mass will now always be at 4:30pm on Saturday.** All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at https://bit.ly/STChurch_School

Mass procedures and guidelines, including mask usage and communion distribution, plus registration links can be found on our website at www.stekc.org.

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing patience, grace and flexibility as we continue to adapt and adjust to the fluid nature of gathering for Mass in the midst of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Fr. Greg and the staff are working hard to keep this experience healthy and holy for all who choose to attend.






