Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

When I was in college seminary, my tuition was funded primarily by my parents, a couple of grants and some funding from the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. When I graduated from Conception Seminary College and moved on to graduate school at Mundelein Seminary in the northwest suburbs of Chicago, things changed significantly. Room and board were paid entirely by the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. I must admit, I didn't really appreciate that at the time, but since ordination, I have come to realize that my priestly service is, in some ways, a return to the people of this diocese for such an investment in my formation. The costs were significant, and this diocese was incredibly supportive and generous. I still depended on my parents and benefactors for vehicle, insurance, gas and spending money, but the diocese covered the complete cost of my graduate school.

That arrangement continues to this day. The diocese invests a great deal in the formation of seminarians. Our hope is that the investment will continue to generate faith-filled, servant-leader priests for the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. This weekend, we take up the second collection for Tomorrow's Priests. We are asked to give generously to support the formation of future priests for our parishes and all the ministries of this diocese. It is part of what we do in collaboration with the Holy Spirit, whom we trust to summon good candidates, and with whom we work to invite, support and pray for these candidates. I am grateful that this diocese did so much to support me, as I now support the work of this diocese as a parish priest.

These are the days when young people who are looking to the future, graduate from grade school, high school and college. Our eighth graders graduated this past Friday night. Congratulations to each of them and their families! What a partnership St. Elizabeth School continues to be here. Parents, teachers, school and parish work together to form new generations in faith and knowledge. What a fantastic legacy St. Elizabeth continues to enjoy in the lives of our alumni. And as we near the end of the year for the rest of the school, we can only be grateful that the Holy Spirit has blessed this year with abundant presence and vitality.

Updated Mass Procedures Effective Immediately Please Read

We continue our regular weekend and weekday Mass schedule. All are invited to attend. **We do require social distancing and mask wearing at each Mass.**

Based on recently updated guidelines from the diocese we will no longer require advance sign-ups or check-in to attend weekend Masses. Additionally, you may enter and exit the church using any doors.

- Masks are still required while in the church, as is 6 feet of social distancing between households. We have opened more pews, making individuals that much more responsible to remain masked and socially distanced. Cleaning of doors and pews will still be required after Mass, and we still need & welcome volunteers to assist with this.
- **Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another with the virus within 14 days are not permitted to enter the church, in accordance with diocesan, national, state, and local health directives.** All attendees are asked to check their temperature at home before coming to church.
- **Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue or who are 60 or older are strongly encouraged, for their own health, to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.**
- We will continue to livestream Mass for as long as needed so that those not attending in person may maintain a spiritual connection with St. Elizabeth. All livestreamed and recorded Masses are accessible through our YouTube channel at https://bit.ly/STChurch_School

We give thanks for all who have helped with this process over the past year, especially our Ushers, check-in staff, cleaners, and parish staff.

Life Corner Presented by The Respect Life Ministry (RLM) of St. Elizabeth Saint Gianna Beretta Molla



In May, we celebrate mothers, those who bring forth and nurture life.

Today we look at the example of a lesser known saint of the twentieth century, Saint Gianna Beretta Molla.

At home in Italy, Gianna Beretta was a modern, educated woman. A college graduate in the 1940s, she went on to medical school and specialized in pediatrics. After marrying an engineer named Pietro Molla, Gianna gave birth to three children, then experienced two miscarriages. Pregnant for the sixth time, doctors found a tumor in her uterus. Rather than undergo the prescribed live-saving treatment of a hysterectomy, Gianna chose to have only the tumor removed and carry her baby to term. A week after her daughter was born, Gianna Beretta Molla died.

With great faith and courage, Gianna Molla made the choice that enabled her daughter to be born. Often, we may wish that we were in different circumstances, but holiness frequently comes from making difficult choices in trying situations.


