Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

By now you should have received a letter from Bishop Johnston announcing the end of the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Effective this weekend, the Bishop invites all to "Come Home to Communion," to return to weekly attendance at Sunday Mass, joining the Sunday Assembly in giving praise and thanksgiving to God.

Concurrent with the end of the **general** dispensation is the start of a **particular** dispensation. This new dispensation means that one does not have the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays in the following circumstances according to our diocese: 1) You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category); 2) You exhibit flu-like symptoms; 3) You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g. recent exposure to someone with COVID-19); 4) You care for the sick or the homebound; 5) You are pregnant; 6) You are 65 years of age or older and are high-risk; 7) You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own (e.g. you lack transportation, live with a chronic illness, etc.); 8) You have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

This means that most of us are to begin attending Sunday Mass again this weekend, except for those who fall under the particular dispensation. If you would like guidance processing this, feel free to contact me. I know this is a big change: a very welcome, long-awaited change for all of us! It has been so good to gather with larger and larger Assemblies for Sunday Mass over the last couple of months, but it will be especially wonderful to realize the fullness of who we are once again. I think it will help us as individuals and as a community to move forward out of the last 14 months and receive the grace God offers us for the future.


Stewardship

We no longer require advance sign-ups or check-in to attend weekend Masses. Additionally, you may enter and exit the church using any doors.

- Masks are now optional for individuals who are fully vaccinated. Unvaccinated individuals should continue wearing a mask when attending Mass.
- Those with serious health concerns, pre-existing conditions, or who are caregivers to the vulnerable, etc., continue to have the grant of a particular dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation. 

Questions of the Week

First Reading:

Moses and the ancient Israelites ratified the covenant God established with them at Mount Sinai with the blood of a sacrificed animal. The sacrificed animal affirmed Israel's commitment: "We will do everything the Lord has told us." Why do you think Israel tied sacrificed blood to their verbal commitment?

Second Reading:

The author of Hebrews teaches us that the sacrificed blood of Christ sanctifies us and offers us eternal redemption. How do you see this connected to ancient Israel's practice of sacrificing animals for their blood?

Gospel:

Mark's account of the institution of the Eucharist is linked to the Jewish Feast of Unleavened Bread when a Passover lamb was sacrificed. What do you think Mark is teaching us in making this connection?

As we gather today to reaffirm our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, we are reminded that we are also the Body of Christ. The mission of the Gospel calls us to be Christ for others. There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost and feeling lonely, marginalized and oppressed, victimized and abused. Every time we receive the Body (and Blood) of Christ, we are asked to become what we eat. Are we willing to step aside from our preoccupations and concerns so that we can be Christ for others? The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us.
