

Ministry Spotlight: Parish School of Religion (PSR)

Parish School of Religion

St. Elizabeth Parish School of Religion (PSR) is a combination home/parish family program for families with children in grades 1 – 8 who do not attend St. Elizabeth school. Parents teach their own children at home each week, using a textbook approved by the Diocese. Once a month, parents and children registered in the program meet in Seton Hall for support, prayer and a group lesson. Family Meetings typically take place on the 2nd Sunday of the month in Seton Hall from 8:45 – 9:45am and are a required part of the program. Parents will receive the dates of monthly meetings at the Parent Meeting August 25, 2021.

1st Reconciliation & 1st Eucharist Preparation

Children not attending St. Elizabeth school who desire to receive 1st Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist prepare for these sacraments through the PSR. Parents will be required to attend a meeting for each sacrament. Students and parents will be required to attend one extra class to prepare for each sacrament.

Your child MUST be registered by August 1, 2021.

To secure your place and ensure that enough books will be ordered, your child must be registered for the 2021/2022 PSR year by August 1. Please go to www.stekc.org and click on Religious Education to register. Students not enrolled in St. Elizabeth School who wish to participate in Parochial League Athletics need to be registered in PSR by August 1.

There is a \$25* supply fee per child that is due at the Parent Meeting/Book Pick-Up on **Wednesday, August 25** at 6:30pm in Seton Hall.

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

I'm sitting on my front porch typing this on one of those beautiful summer days we all savor. The heat of last week has given way to upper 70's and sunshine. It's wonderful to sit outside without sweating much, though I know it'll be short-lived. And since I profess to love summer, I won't complain too much about the heat. It's just nice to have a break from such intensity.

I continue to be astounded at the pace of life this summer. This is usually a quieter time in a parish, especially one with a school, and it usually affords a chance to recharge after the rigors of busy days. But I'm realizing more all the time that this is going to be a different kind of summer. There is so much bottled up energy from the past year, a lot of delayed business and an eagerness to reconnect to some version of life as it used to be. For me that has meant the clashing of lots of demands and requests. There are the fun summer get-togethers with family and friends that always mark this time of year, but there is also a lot of catching up in terms of Sacraments (baptisms and weddings delayed from last year), appointments and meetings that have been postponed or rescheduled, and the challenge (believe it or not) of getting back to the usual way of celebrating Mass. I've forgotten some things, gotten used to alternate ways of doing things, and even fallen in to some bad habits. I've also noticed that my singing voice has gotten rusty! As strange as it was to shift into pandemic liturgy, it is strangely just as strange to shift out of it. Change is hard, even when it's good change, because change takes energy. There's adjustment, disorientation and even some mistakes.

On the other hand, it has been so exciting and uplifting to see such great crowds in church on weekends. I have enjoyed reconnecting with so many people, and hearing and witnessing such full, conscious, active participation in the Eucharist. Many of us have said recently that the past year has deepened our appreciation and hunger for the Eucharist. Saturday evening and Sunday Masses have held a heightened sense of joy and celebration! So in the midst of adjustment, disorientation and mistakes, it's so life-giving to gather again as the People of God, celebrating the bonds of faith in this community and praising God for all that is good.

We no longer require advance sign-ups or check-in to attend weekend Masses. Additionally, you may enter and exit the church using any doors.

- Masks are now optional for individuals who are fully vaccinated. Unvaccinated individuals should continue wearing a mask when attending Mass.
- Those with serious health concerns, pre-existing conditions, or who are caregivers to the vulnerable, etc., continue to have the grant of a particular dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.
