## Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

I wrote a couple of weeks ago about the liturgy as public prayer, and how that perspective transforms the Mass for me. If Mass is public prayer, then we are called to engage with the rest of the Assembly and do our part as participants to help each other pray. While the liturgy has a component of private prayer, the public nature of it calls us to public participation.

Another essential quality of the liturgy is that it's a ritual, and as such, is repetitive. Any ritual we follow in our lives is, by nature, repetitive. The way we begin our day is usually very much a ritual. Make coffee. Check email. Pray. Get ready for work or school. We usually follow the same steps in the same order to begin our day. I find that if my morning ritual gets disturbed or interrupted, it can really affect the rest of my day. I can feel off balance or unfocused. Rituals have power to hold things together and give us a sense of peace in the midst of life's turmoil.

That is the beauty of the Mass as ritual. As our prayer follows the same basic structure week in and week out, as we often proclaim and sing the same words each time we celebrate the Eucharist, there is a grounding peace in the sameness. Ritual holds things together and puts us in a different mindset where we can suspend all the busy thoughts and worries, and be present to what is most real. Truths are elevated, the reality of our lives becomes more apparent, and God's presence and action is revealed. Ritual ideally brings inner stillness and peace, and attunes us to those deeper currents of our lives that are often obscured by the noisy, unpredictable happenings of the everyday.

It may be difficult to appreciate sometimes, but the Mass is supposed to be repetitive. As with any ritual, the repetition stills the mind and leads us into deeper waters where we might actually be more open to God's voice, where we might be less defensive and guarded, and find the freedom to be who we really are in God's sight.

#### Presented by The Respect Life Ministry (RLM) of St. Elizabeth
