

Each year we have an opportunity to renew our faith in God's family, and to show our gratitude for all we have received as members of that family. We make pledges to invest ourselves in the ministries of St. Elizabeth Parish. These pledges connect us to those who have gone before us in faith. We really are part of the same family as parishioners of St. Elizabeth across the generations. Our parish family continues that great legacy, and we are deeply connected to our parish family of 100 years ago. We are one family walking together in faith. We may be at different points on the journey, but it's the same journey, the same faith, the same family, the same destination. Ultimately, this is not about what we do, but what God will do through us as we open ourselves up to the power of His love and life.

Our stewardship appeals as parish and diocese will be happening together again this year. This integrated approach connects all we do as a parish with all the good we do as a diocese. We continue to respond to Jesus' call to share the Good News, to make disciples, and to praise God in all we say and do. This invitation to share our blessings allows us to deepen in trust that God's goodness will continue and enables us to be instruments of grace through our generous sharing.

Scripture gives us the guideline of a 10% tithe of our gross income, with 5% to the parish, 1% to the diocese, and 4% to ministries, special collections, and other charities of our choosing. Along with your 5% tithe to St. Elizabeth, we ask that you discern how you will share your time and talent through the ministries of St. Elizabeth Parish.

Our school has been the largest ministry of our parish since 1922 and will be part of our community for a long time to come. Our parish school has contributed in so many positive ways to the greater Kansas City community and continues to leave a strong legacy of Catholic education. Many of you are also graduates of St. Elizabeth and now your children attend here as well. That's so special! I love our St. Elizabeth family and I know you do too. Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

There's an old saying in parish ministry: "No money, no mission." It makes sense. The fact is that it costs money to build the Reign of God. We pay talented, faith-filled people to direct and sustain our ministries. We maintain large facilities in need of constant repair, heated and cooled by ever-increasingly sophisticated systems. We pay for lawn service, landscaping, parking lot repair, roofs, electricity and cleaning. For us to sustain our mission, we need significant financial resources. Without a doubt, one of the most challenging aspects of parish ministry these days is finances. I know of no pastor who doesn't worry about finances, especially if a parish operates a school.

In the same way, we can say, "No volunteers, no mission." If we don't have people share their talents and expertise, their time, energy and gifts, the ministries of a parish will limp along one-dimensionally, if at all. Daily we have parishioners who share their time, faith and energy to visit the sick and homebound, who share their talents with our school community, who help with facility maintenance and updates, who feed the hungry from our food pantry and who serve in liturgical ministries at weekday and Sunday Mass. Both school and parish ministries thrive because we hear the call to share our time and talent.

"No money, no volunteers, no mission." Fortunately this calling presents us with an opportunity. If we really want to live our faith, if we really want this parish to be a leaven for good in Waldo, Kansas City, and the world, we all have the opportunity to do just that by sharing our blessings. Everything we need to live the mission entrusted to us is right in our midst. Everything we need to bring the Kingdom of God to life here and now is available to us. God has been so good to us. We are blessed, and we know it.

Our annual Stewardship Appeal is an opportunity to show our gratitude, our commitment, and our enthusiasm for the Reign of God. Blessings have been entrusted to every one of us. And God asks us in faith to return a portion of those, a tithe of 10%, to build that Reign: 5% to our parish, 1% to the diocese and 4% to other charities of our choice. Now is the time for us to commit, or recommit, to that Biblical standard of generosity to build the Kingdom of God at St. Elizabeth Parish and in the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.


Stewardship
