Second Sunday of Advent

It is this light of God's glory for which we are asked to pave the way and straighten the paths of our lives so that it can shine. With all that life can ask of us and bring to us, it is our task to constantly discern what is of value. 

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

I attended a webinar today hosted by one of the textbook publishers used by our school. The goal was to help ground and equip leaders for the unique challenges of life in the world as it is. One of the things the presenter articulated that I found very helpful was that, in an age of technology like ours, many people experience 1) reduced empathy 2) increased anxiety and 3) more negative affect. He commented that, in our day and age, the average person spends 5 hours a day on a smartphone or tablet, and that increased interaction with electronic devices lessens human interaction, and thus can quickly lower our empathy for other people. There's a detachment from other human beings as we connect more to screens, and thus we can slowly (or quickly) lose our capacity to understand or appreciate the feelings of others.

Increased anxiety emerges, he said, from a steady diet of social media in which everyone seems to be living a perfect life, portrayed in selfies and other photos that portray a world in which everyone else appears to be much happier than I might feel on any given day. With a constant barrage of family, friends, acquaintances and co-workers sharing photos and news that suggest nothing but perfect bliss, it's easy for us to think that there's something wrong with us if our lives don't look the same at that moment.

Increased negative affect is a natural result of the constant bombardment of bad news to which we're subject. News feeds, apps, social media and television have us constantly exposed to so much darkness at work in the world, probably in ways to which human beings have never before been subject. He added that increased stress leads us to regress emotionally, so that when we're tired or overwhelmed, we can easily respond from our worst selves.

He suggested that we all work at rediscovering our deep inner selves through prayer and simplicity, that we practice gratitude for creation and redemption and see ourselves as bridge builders in the world today. I hear in that a clear call to practice Advent, to wake up, to make room and to look for God's arrival in our lives. It's always the season to live like this, but especially now, when the world is so weary and ready for good news.



Social Services Notes

Thank you for your continued generous support of our Food Pantry.

Current food pantry needs are: *no immediate needs*

St. Elizabeth Social Services and St. Vincent de Paul Volunteers

The St. Vincent de Paul volunteers support the Social Service ministry in our parish. A large number of those we help live at or below the poverty level. Donations to this ministry literally keep lights, gas and water on, pay medical bills, pay mortgage payments and put food on the table. We also provide home repairs for parishioners or those who generally live within our neighborhood. This year our volunteers rebuilt a porch and handicapped ramp for a homeowner who could not afford to pay the labor costs. We provide volunteers to help serve food at the One City Café, a ministry of Bishop Sullivan Center. We also support a Caring Visitors program for parishioners who need periodic communication about their health or other needs or critical transportation. We also support the EmBRACE Justice ministry at St. Elizabeth's.

In 2021, we are once again using our reserves to meet financial needs because our expenses exceed our income to date. Through the first week of November, we have collected \$22,116 and have had expenses of \$40,774. This means we are short \$18,658. Please consider using the yellow St. Vincent de Paul envelope in your monthly envelope packet or simply note on a check placed in the collection basket that your donation is to support the St. Elizabeth St. Vincent de Paul/Social Services ministry or send a donation to the parish offices.

As winter approaches, we know many will need help with utility bills. Your donation now will truly help ease such burdens in our community. Thank you for your thoughtful generosity.
