




The Holy Family

Stewardship



Building Our Legacy

The term narthex" refers to a porch or gathering space outside the main worship space (or nave). Early Christians used this term to refer to the outer portico where penitents (those who had committed serious sins) and catechumens (converts preparing for baptism) gathered for worship. Penitents and catechumens were not permitted to worship with other Christians in the main worship space until they had completed their orientation or reorientation to Christian life. Why don't we call this space the lobby? Lobby is another term for the same kind of covered walk or portico near the entrance of a larger main space, but one that was adapted from political use, rather than Christian use. The lobby (lobium in Latin) is where the "lobbyists" would gather to seek to influence the votes of lawmakers and others admitted to the space where decisions were made.

Today, this gathering place functions as an interface between the church and the world, a space for welcoming. Father Paul Turner, Diocesan Director of Worship, refers to the narthex as "the people's sacristy", or the place where the people prepare themselves to participate in Mass. As part of the first phase of Building Our Legacy, St. Elizabeth went from a cramped vestibule to a true narthex. Thank you!


2022 Free Throw Contest Sunday, January 30 1:00pm STE School Gym

St. Elizabeth Social Services and St. Vincent de Paul Volunteers

The St. Vincent de Paul volunteers support the Social Service ministry in our parish. A large number of those we help live at or below the poverty level. Donations to this ministry literally keep lights, gas and water on, pay medical bills, pay mortgage payments and put food on the table. We also provide home repairs for parishioners or those who generally live within our neighborhood. This year our volunteers rebuilt a porch and handicapped ramp for a homeowner who could not afford to pay the labor costs. We provide volunteers to help serve food at the One City Café, a ministry of Bishop Sullivan Center. We also support a Caring Visitors program for parishioners who need periodic communication about their health or other needs or critical transportation. We also support the EmbRace Justice ministry at St. Elizabeth's.

In 2021, we are once again using our reserves to meet financial needs because our expenses exceed our income to date. Through the first week of November, we have collected \$22,116 and have had expenses of \$40,774. This means we are short \$18,658. Please consider using the yellow St. Vincent de Paul envelope in your monthly envelope packet or simply note on a check placed in the collection basket that your donation is to support the St. Elizabeth St. Vincent de Paul/Social Services ministry, or send a donation to the parish offices.

As winter approaches, we know many will need help with utility bills. Your donation now will truly help ease such burdens in our community. Thank you for your thoughtful generosity.




