




Stewardship

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

As the first American-born canonized saint, St. Elizabeth Seton has particular importance to us as a parish that enjoys her patronage. We celebrate her feast day this Tuesday!

Elizabeth Seton was a wife and mother. She shared the vocation to which many of us have been called, to be married and to be a parent. In living as a wife and mother, Elizabeth Seton brought her faith to bear on her daily life. There were everyday joys and struggles that many of us share with her, and in these everyday realities, we share a call to be holy.

Elizabeth Seton was also a widow. She suffered the pain of losing her spouse, and knew the same grief and loss that many of us bear today. After her husband's death, she had to find her way forward, relying on God's grace and her own God-given talents. This is a journey that many of us walk here at St. Elizabeth, to bury a spouse, to give thanks for them, to grieve and to keep walking the journey before us.

As a convert to Catholicism, Elizabeth Seton's own journey of faith mirrors that of many in our community. Raised as a dedicated Episcopalian, she heard a call to move toward the Catholic faith after the death of her husband. Inspired by the example of Catholic friends, she made the decision to become Catholic, accepting the challenge and opportunity to develop new relationships in a new community of faith. In our parish, so many excellent examples of this same journey abound. So many who have embraced the Catholic faith at St. Elizabeth serve as the best examples of it, cherishing it and living it with joy and vigor.

St. Elizabeth Seton founded the first Catholic school in the United States, a ministry to which our parish is strongly and uniquely devoted. Recognizing the need for children, especially poor and immigrant children, to have a strong and solid education, she made tremendous sacrifices to open and operate this school. It is a ministry to which she was strongly devoted, as are we.

St. Elizabeth Seton reminds us that we are all called to – and capable of – holiness. Through prayer, discernment and action, she allowed the Gospel to come to life in unique and exciting ways. We give thanks for her patronage and claim again our call to imitate her as a faithful follower of Jesus.
