

The Baptism of the Lord


"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ."— Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

Preschool, Prekindergarten and Kindergarten Enrollment Dates

St. Elizabeth Catholic School is proud to provide an active and positive environment for quality early childhood education. Children learn through play, independent work/skill-building, small group instruction, learning centers, art, music, and physical education. Our ECC, through positive interaction between educator and your child, strives to reach the whole child—socially, emotionally, cognitively, physically, and spiritually.

Monday, January 10, 2022 – Preschool/Pre-K re-enrollment for current STE students and siblings will begins. Current families re-enroll through the Sycamore portal.

Wednesday, January 19, 2022 – Registration for families new to Preschool and Pre-kindergarten at St. Elizabeth begins. Registration applications will be available on our website at www.stekcschool.org on January 19th.

- Preschool students must turn 3 before December 31, 2022
- Prekindergarten students must be age 4 by August 1, 2022
- All students must be fully potty-trained

A \$200 registration fee is due at the time of your application. Tuition is billed monthly from September through May.

5 days a week* – \$736 a month for STE parishioners / \$764 for non-parishioners. *Highly recommended for Pre-K students

3 days a week – \$579 a month for STE parishioners / \$602 for non-parishioners

2 days a week** – \$490 a month for STE parishioners / \$509 for non-parishioners **This option is for Preschool only

Wednesday, January 19, 2022 – Kindergarten enrollment for the 2022 – 2023 school year begins. Kindergarten students must be **age 5 by August 1, 2022**. Current school families will enroll through the Sycamore portal. New families may apply through our website at www.stekcschool.org. Please check the website for tuition information.

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord always concludes the Christmas Season. While Christmas began for many people the day after Thanksgiving and concluded the day after Christmas, we began Christmas, liturgically speaking, on Christmas Day and conclude the season today, celebrating Holy Family, Solemnity of Mary, Epiphany and several other feasts along the way. The Baptism of the Lord serves as a turning point from one season to another, and does so with the focus on the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, setting the tone for the liturgical year ahead. As His baptism inaugurates His public ministry and the arrival of the Reign of God, our baptism immerses us into that new way of life, one that will never be without hope. No matter what kind of mess is shaking up the world, no matter what kind of darkness we endure, no matter how discouraged we might feel, our baptism orients us toward hope in the Reign of God. Every time we baptize an infant or an adult, we rejoice because we know life will never be the same for them. It changes us. It changes everything.

I don't remember the water pouring over my head. Nor do I recall being anointed with Chrism. And I have no visual recollection of my godparents holding the lighted candle. But my baptism has had a profound impact on my life. That brief but powerful ritual, that first Sacramental celebration of my life, set me on a path to follow Jesus. And the impact is not just temporal but eternal. I am following Jesus through the waters of Baptism into the Christian life as a Catholic, but as I follow Him on earth, it's really a path that leads to eternity. What threshold Baptism is for us!




