Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers—do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.

School Corner

Preschool, Prekindergarten and Kindergarten Enrollment Dates

St. Elizabeth Catholic School is proud to provide an active and positive environment for quality early childhood education. Children learn through play, independent work/skill-building, small group instruction, learning centers, art, music, and physical education. Our ECC, through positive interaction between educator and your child, strives to reach the whole child—socially, emotionally, cognitively, physically, and spiritually.

Monday, January 10, 2022 – Preschool/Pre-K re-enrollment for current STE students and siblings begins. Current families re-enroll through the Sycamore portal.

Wednesday, January 19, 2022 – Registration for families new to Preschool and Pre-kindergarten at St. Elizabeth begins. Registration applications will be available on our website at www.stekcschool.org on January 19th.

- Preschool students must turn **3 before December 31, 2022**
- Prekindergarten students must be **age 4 by August 1, 2022**
- All students must be fully potty-trained

A \$200 registration fee is due at the time of your application. Tuition is billed monthly from September through May.

5 days a week* – \$736 a month for STE parishioners / \$764 for non-parishioners. ***Highly recommended for Pre-K students**

3 days a week – \$579 a month for STE parishioners / \$602 for non-parishioners

2 days a week** – \$490 a month for STE parishioners / \$509 for non-parishioners ****This option is for Preschool only**

Kindergarten 2022/2023 – Kindergarten enrollment for the coming school year is being moved from January to a later date. We will announce the new date here and on the school website (www.stekcschool.org). Kindergarten students must be **age 5 by August 1, 2022**. Current school families will enroll through the Sycamore portal. New families may apply through our website at www.stekcschool.org.

Pastor's Corner

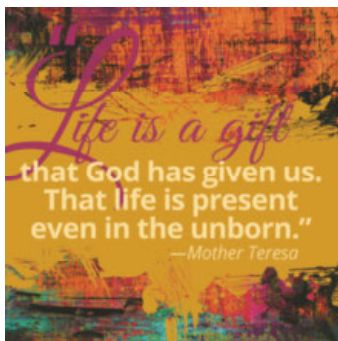
Dear Parishioners,

I know there's plenty of good news in the world. There's plenty in our parish community every day. But all too easily, the bad news can overwhelm us and drown out the good news.

A couple of years ago, our diocese purchased a home for \$10, a beautiful home in need of new vision and renovation. Through the generosity of donors, the home was completely renovated and reborn, and is now opening its doors to pregnant women in crisis. St. Mary's Home for Mothers is a place of refuge, a place of welcome, that will shelter, love and empower young women experiencing an unplanned pregnancy. It's a place created by our diocese and the Archdiocese of Kansas City, Kansas to be a positive and life-changing home for pregnant women and their children who might need a place to stay and a place to make a change. St. Mary's Home for Mothers will house up to 15 people, and will offer the help of social workers, a therapist and religious sisters who will offer care and spiritual direction.

It's good news. It's something positive and life-affirming. It's a loving response to everyday crises that can often leave us feeling hopeless or discouraged. 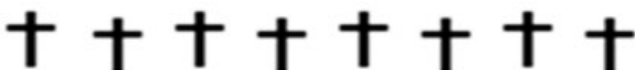

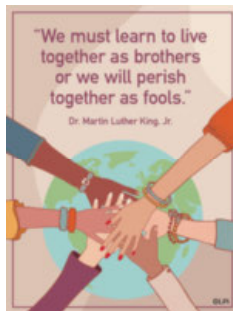
**EmbRace Justice News
Martin Luther King, Jr. Day,
Monday, January 17, 2022**

On Good Friday, 1963, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and others were arrested for participation in a peaceful and non-violent civil rights march protesting segregation in Birmingham, AL. That very same afternoon 8 white clergymen published a letter, "A Call to Unity," in the Birmingham News strongly "... urging our Negro community to withdraw support from these demonstrations, ..." and called out King indirectly as an outside leader/organizer of the march.



While sitting in a cell in the Birmingham City Jail, Dr. King wrote a 20-page letter addressing the points in the clergymen's letter. He was unapologetic in his response. Righteous anger is apparent but hate never entered his words. He asks what kind of extremists are we to be: extremist of hate or extremists for love? He wrote as a man of faith speaking not only to other men of faith but to all of us, then and now. His letter, in the end, is one of hope for the United States and mankind.
