Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Human history reveals many periods where people lost a sense of God's transcendence. It may even be argued that human beings have been wandering and lost more than they have been at home and focused. Human nature being what it is, we struggle with who God really is — the God of our salvation history or the "gods" of human constructs. Relying on our own designs and pursuits, we forget that we really are meant to listen to One upon whom the Spirit of the Lord rests, Jesus Christ, and not to ourselves. That same history that reveals our fickleness and infidelity also reveals God's constancy and faithfulness. God always finds us.

As people wander and fumble to find their way, God is there bringing them back to holiness and giving them the assurance of His presence. We have to allow God's Word, God's life, to touch us and change us. It can make us more flexible and attentive to the sacred in all facets of life so that every day is one that is holy. Every day is a time when fulfillment is possible for one's soul. Jesus stood before those gathered in the synagogue as the fulfillment of words of promise that were echoed long ago. God doesn't forget. He always comes for us.

Now it is time to remember to go to God. Sometimes our lives are so confused and tangled that it is difficult to see the Word and hand of God. But when we realize, deep within, the depth of friendship God offers to us it really has the power to turn sadness to joy. The promise is fulfilled. Going frequently to God's Word, allowing ourselves to be enriched and rejuvenated, and pondering the certainty of God's fidelity and promise permanently transforms us. We will be more aware of the sacred and the holy and less invested in things that pull us away.

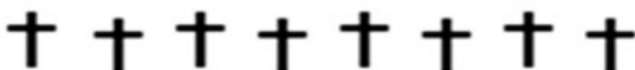

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

One of the most formative years in my life was 1991 – 92. It's the year I spent at Church of the Risen Christ, a black Catholic parish here in Kansas City (later merged with St. Joseph Parish to form St. Monica Parish). Risen Christ was located on the corner of Linwood and Benton, and was pastored by my friend Fr. Mike Roach. I had taken a couple of years away from the seminary from 1989-1991, but in that time, I heard a very clear call to return. Before returning to the seminary, however, the diocese asked me to spend this pastoral year living in the central city, immersing myself in the life of Risen Christ and working alongside the pastor and staff.

This pastoral year changed me. Being a minority for the first time in my life revealed so many assumptions I had about the world. It allowed me to view our city, our church and our world from a different perspective. It challenged me to accept the ugly reality of racism, and even admit that there were bits and pieces of it in me (assumptions, stereotypes). It also gave me the experience of a dynamic parish full of faith-filled people, and it was so life-giving! The people of Risen Christ welcomed me, loved me, educated me, called forth the best from me, and treated me to an eventful, joyful year. I hope I was able to give something, but I know I received much more. I returned to the seminary a different person, excited about parish ministry and the future.

It's a blessing to view life through the eyes of the other, to get out of our comfortable and limited point of view and see through different eyes. Not that any individual point of view is bad, but it will always be limited. We see some things very differently in those moments and realize a bias in our perspective and our experience. It's a gift to be enriched and to have our vision expanded. And as we share a common humanity, it motivates us to build the world on God's justice and universal kindness.

First Reading:

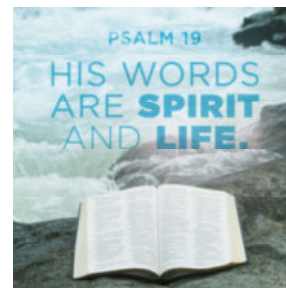

Preschool & Pre-K Enrollment Dates

St. Elizabeth Catholic School is proud to provide an active and positive environment for quality early childhood education. Children learn through play, independent work/skill-building, small group instruction, learning centers, art, music, and physical education. Our ECC, through positive interaction between educator and your child, strives to reach the whole child—socially, emotionally, cognitively, physically, and spiritually.

Preschool/Pre-K re-enrollment has begun. Current families re-enroll through the Sycamore portal. Registration applications for families new to Preschool and Pre-K at St. Elizabeth are available on our website at www.stekcschool.org.

- Preschool students must turn **3 before December 31, 2022**
- Prekindergarten students must be **age 4 by August 1, 2022**
- All students must be fully potty-trained

A \$200 registration fee is due at the time of your application. Tuition is billed monthly from September through May.

5 days a week* – \$736 a month for STE parishioners / \$764 for non-parishioners. ***Highly recommended for Pre-K students**

3 days a week – \$579 a month for STE parishioners / \$602 for non-parishioners
