Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

In 1997, I traveled to El Salvador with a group from Visitation when I was Associate Pastor there. It was such an exciting and eventful experience, and I remember looking out the window when the plane took off from El Salvador and saying, "I'll be back someday." In the mean time, I took two trips to Guatemala when I was pastor at Our Lady of Guadalupe in St. Joseph. Each journey was equally full of grace as the trip to El Salvador. But I haven't forgotten my promise about El Salvador from 1997: "I'll be back someday."

Someday has finally arrived. I am traveling with our delegation to El Salvador this Wednesday, 2/2, through Wednesday, 2/9! I'm excited about this journey, as I will see El Salvador again, and encounter the people and places with whom we as a parish are connected. It will be an honor to meet the young people and their families who benefit from the scholarship program. It will be exciting to see the people and places we help with basic needs of clean water and safe shelter. And it will be inspiring to listen to people's stories of faith in the midst of challenging life journeys.

What I learned on my previous trips to Central America is that the travelers, even as we give significantly to support our brothers and sisters in El Salvador, receive much more than we give. The dynamic of such a relationship offers tremendous blessing in both directions. I remember so many people I've met in both El Salvador and Guatemala who, in spite of significant challenges and hardship, have a deep and lively faith, a joy that is enduring, and a generosity and concern for one another that is inspiring and instructive.

I'm excited about the journey. There are some extra steps to take since we're traveling during a pandemic, of course, including a negative COVID test prior to departure and return. We have also been assured that Covid protocols, including masking and social distancing, are being practiced there faithfully, and that every step will be taken to keep us healthy. Pray for us as we travel. And know that we will pray for you, and give thanks for the honor to represent St. Elizabeth once again on this journey of faith!

Preschool & Pre-K Enrollment Dates

St. Elizabeth Catholic School is proud to provide an active and positive environment for quality early childhood education. Children learn through play, independent work/ skill-building, small group instruction, learning centers, art, music, and physical education. Our ECC, through positive interaction between educator and your child, strives to reach the whole child—socially, emotionally, cognitively, physically, and spiritually.

Preschool/Pre-K re-enrollment has begun. Current families re-enroll through the Sycamore portal. Registration applications for families new to Preschool and Pre-K at St. Elizabeth are available on our website at www.stekcschool.org.

- Preschool students must turn *3 before December 31, 2022*
- Prekindergarten students must be age 4 by August 1, 2022
- All students must be fully potty-trained

A \$200 registration fee is due at the time of your application. Tuition is billed monthly from September through May.
