VIRTUS, PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN FOR ADULTS

All employees of the Archdiocese (including clergy and consecrated laymen and laywomen) and all volunteers (including Vacation Bible School volunteers), over the age of 18, who have substantial contact with children and/or youth, in the school or church, are required to submit a background check and attend VIRTUS, the awareness session of the Archdiocese's child abuse program, Protecting God's Children for Adults, prior to working with children or youth.

All VIRTUS sessions are online, **however, this will be changing soon.** You will need to register an account with our Archdiocese and complete the background check and paperwork.

Go to: <https://www.virtusonline.org>.

1. Click on "First-Time Registrant"
2. Click on "Begin the registration process."
3. On the "Select" organization drop-down menu, select "Kansas City in Kansas (Archdiocese)".
4. Create a User ID and Password, complete the profile information, and select a class to attend.
5. You must complete the background check and paperwork at this point.
6. Plan to have 20-30 minutes to register and complete the online paperwork. The system will not allow you to save what you start working on and return at a later time to complete. DO NOT USE THE BACK BUTTON ON THE ADDRESS BAR, OR IT WILL DELETE YOUR PROGRESS AND YOU WILL HAVE TO START OVER.
7. VIRTUS Registration MUST BE DONE ON A COMPUTER, not a tablet, iPad or phone. The system will not allow these devices due to security reasons.

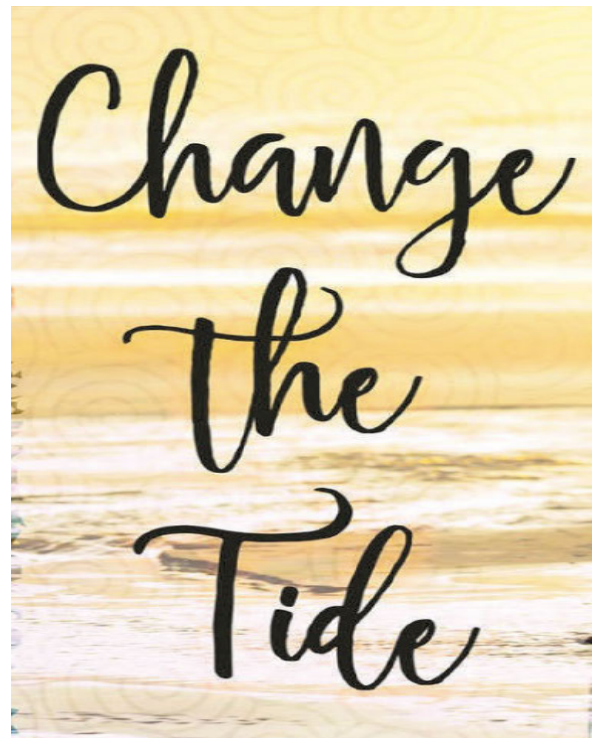

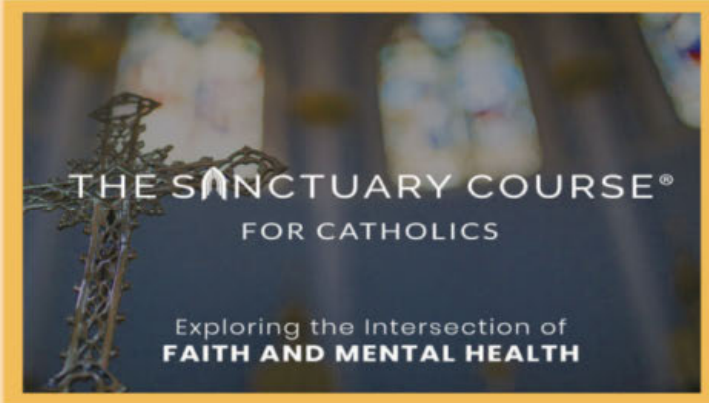

SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION

By The Social Concerns for Peace and Justice Committee

This week we are sharing with you an excerpt from Brian McLaren's presentation for the 56th Annual Franciscan Federation Conference (AFC) June 12, 2021, a virtual experience. His presentation was entitled "A Franciscan Renaissance." This Franciscan Federation address was transcribed by Sisters Jeanne Nisley and Dominica LoBianco, Sisters of St. Francis of Philadelphia

When a progressive spiritual movement like the one Jesus launched stops moving forward entirely, or moves at the pace of a glacier before global warming, or even worse, when it actively regresses, we need to ask whether it still reflects the ethos of its 30 year-old founder who was dead by 33. It's unlikely that people much older than Jesus would follow him, so we can assume that his first disciples were at least young-ish, too.

Of course, those young disciples who weren't martyred eventually grew old, and special honor was no doubt given to the senior leaders of the movement. Within a century, the youthful vigor of the original movement became harder to detect, with internal turf wars, power struggles, and belief-policing replacing the founder's original outward vision of: speaking truth to power, proclaiming liberation to the oppressed, and deploying nonviolent peacemakers willing to die as witnesses to peace.

That outward vision would gradually become the exception

rather than the rule, occasionally flaring up in a young reformer like Francis of Assisi, who began his ministry in his early 20s. Clare joined him when she was only 18, and soon was leading her parallel movement. St. Teresa of Avila ran away from home at 20 to begin her visionary work, and St. John of the Cross joined her movement when he was 25. Among Protestants, Martin Luther was 33 when he nailed his 95 theses to the Wittenberg door (as the story goes). John Calvin was 19 when he began writing his Institutes of the Christian Religion, and 26 when the first edition was published.

The Christian movement, at its most vital, has been a youth movement. The Christian movement, at its most depressing, has been a gerontocracy.

The wisest thing older generations of white Christians could do starting now would be to invest unprecedented trust, money, opportunity, and coaching (without control) in rising younger generations, women and men, of diverse racial and economic backgrounds, listening to them, learning from them, trusting the Spirit to be alive in them, and then getting behind them. If we are to stay Christian, it cannot be with the old white boys' club of the religious gerontocracy at the helm.

Yes, we need true elders as much as ever, if not more. Instead of hoarding their power and wisdom, they can choose to empower and equip younger leaders, especially leaders from groups that have been historically marginalized.

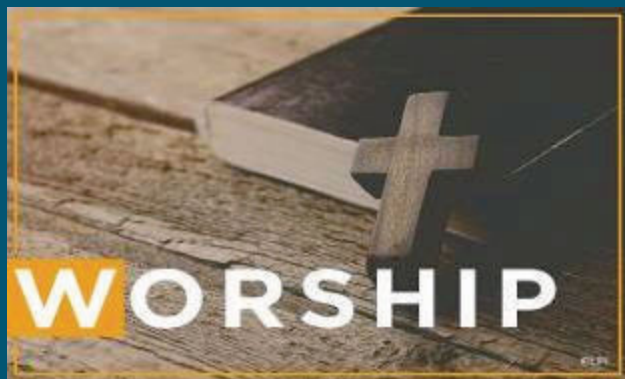

CUENTO NÚMERO 34

Los 300.000 del ricachón y la monedita de una vieja pobre (Marcos 12, 41-44)

Los ejemplos que Jesús da en la Biblia son tan universales como el mundo, y los podemos encontrar a la vuelta de cada esquina.

Lo que el Señor narra en su evangelio lo constanté hace unos años. Abrí el diario y me tope con esta noticia: "Ayer, lunes 8 de noviembre, el presidente del directorio de la conocida empresa Sanders & Brooks Inc., que ha recalcado en nuestros mercados en el rubro informática, convocó a una conferencia de prensa en el Hotel Alvear, para presentarse ante el público porteño. Todos los medios de comunicación social se hicieron presentes. El periodismo nacional alabó la visión social y la sensibilidad de esa empresa, que hizo público un proyecto para implementar en las escuelas, y significó su apoyo efectivo con una donación de U\$S 300.000. Finalizado el acto, la Fundación que administrará dichos fondos agradeció la iniciativa, formulando votos para que otras entidades imitaran el gesto. Se rubricó la velada con un vino de honor..."

¡Muy bien! Todos, de pie, aplaudimos con entusiasmo esperanzado este hecho público, eficaz, real, palpable, ejemplar, insertado en los intereses académicos de la juventud de nuestros días, y en las necesidades de un país que debe despegar tecnológicamente. ¡Bienvenidos los U\$S 300.000! Se podría criticar tanta publicidad, pues la mano izquierda supo lo que hizo la derecha, pero... Jesús dijo que había que poner la vela en un candelero alto, para que se viera, y no debajo de un cajón. Por lo tanto, ¡hasta la Biblia apoya la publicidad de las buenas acciones de Sanders & Brooks Inc., pues son ejemplares y deben mover a la imitación!

Yo había participado de ese encuentro, acompañando a un buen amigo que trabaja en la Comisión de Medios de Comunicación Social, del Episcopado argentino, y la noticia del periódico confirmó lo que habíamos visto y oído.

Pasamos frente a una iglesia céntrica y, por pura casualidad, nos paramos en la puerta para concertar una entrevista futura, agenda en mano. Y aquí constatamos algo sorprendente. Vimos un calco de lo que Jesús nos decía, acerca del "óbolo de la viuda", frente a la suculenta limosna que dieron los grandes de la tierra.

Un mendigo, de los que suelen tener su "parada" a la entrada de los templos, mujer vieja, pobre y sucia, hurgó en sus bolsillos y sacó dos moneditas de diez centavos. Estaba sentada sobre unas bolsas y rodeada de algunos paquetitos con sus "pertenencias". Se levantó con dificultad, pues tenía una pierna tan vieja como ella y muy usada, y entregó esas monedas a un "colega", otro mendigo que también pedía limosna a los fieles, como pordiosero: ¡por el amor de Dios!

No nos cupo la menor duda de que los 300.000.- "Made in USA" son mucho más que veinte centavos "Made in Argentina". Pero en la rara matemática de Cristo, esta mujer, de edad desconocida y profesión "mendiga", dio más que la empresa multinacional, porque no dio de lo que le sobraba, sino de lo que más necesitaba, lo que ella misma requería para sobrevivir. ¡A buen entendedor, pocas palabras...!

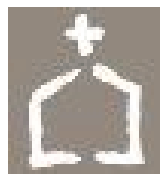

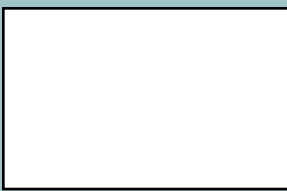

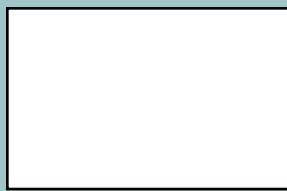
