



In 2019, an activist state court radically changed the Kansas Constitution, making it almost impossible to regulate abortion in even the simplest of ways. VIRTUS, PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN FOR ADULTS

All employees of the Archdiocese (including clergy and consecrated laymen and laywomen) and all volunteers (including Vacation Bible School volunteers), over the age of 18, who have substantial contact with children and/or youth, in the school or church, are required to submit a background check and attend VIRTUS, the awareness session of the Archdiocese's child abuse program, Protecting God's Children for Adults, prior to working with children or youth.

All VIRTUS sessions are online, **however, this will be changing soon**. You will need to register an account with our Archdiocese and complete the background check and paperwork. Go to: **https://www.virtusonline.org.**


- 1. Click on "First-Time Registrant"
- 2. Click on "Begin the registration process."
- 3. On the "Select" organization drop-down menu, select "Kansas City in Kansas (Archdiocese)".
- 4. Create a User ID and Password, complete the profile information, and select a class to attend.
- 5. You must complete the background check and paperwork at this point.
- 6. Plan to have 20-30 minutes to register and complete the online paperwork. The system will not allow you to save what you start working on and return at a later time to complete. DO NOT USE THE BACK BUTTON ON THE ADDRESS BAR, OR IT WILL DELETE YOUR PROGRESS AND YOU WILL HAVE TO START OVER.
- 7. VIRTUS Registration MUST BE DONE ON A COMPUTER, not a tablet, iPad or phone. The system will not allow these devices due to security reasons.
- 8. Complete training Protecting God's Children® Online Awareness Session 3.0 Online, this takes about 3 hours.
- 9. Be aware you will have monthly training bulletins emailed to you that take about 2-5 minutes to complete. You must stay current to volunteer.

A Concrete Sign of Mercy

The year 2020 united the whole world in suffering as the COVID-19 pandemic took millions of lives and created widespread economic hardship due to the closure of nonessential businesses. In Lebanon, the hardship of the pandemic was compounded by a catastrophic explosion of a warehouse at the port in Beirut on August 4, 2020. The blast killed more than 200 people and injured and displaced thousands more.

With funds collected through the Peter's Pence Collection, the Holy Father provided an immediate response of €250,000 to the Church in Lebanon, which made medical care, temporary shelter, and other basic needs available to victims through the efforts of Caritas Lebanon, Caritas Internationalis, and sister organizations of Caritas. CUENTO NÚMERO 38

¡Echen las redes y esta noche cenaremos como reyes! (Juan 21, 1-14)

El buen padre Mamerto Menapace, a quien yo no soy digno de desatar ni las correas de sus sandalias (¡él sí que es cuentista de ley!), quizás ubicaría este cuentito en el Paraná, para ver si hay pique de algún dorado o zurubí... o de mojarritas, si la cosa va mal. Nos pondría en el contexto de una puesta de sol litoraleña y, ¡por qué no!, posiblemente los mosquitos jorobarían a los pescadores. Sin embargo, como no soy entrerriano ni correntino, y donde nací, no hay ríos ni lagos ni mares y, en consecuencia, no hay más pescados que los que podría comprar en el mercado, no tengo más remedio, entonces, que irme a Medio Oriente, al Tiberíades, y ver qué puedo entresacar del hecho que Juan nos narra en su cuento, que yo volveré a narrar, con mi estilo.

Varios discípulos de Jesús, entendidos en materia de peces, pues eran pescadores, decidieron ver si algún pez no demasiado avispado, pica la carnada... Ellos eran peritos en mareas bajas y altas, en el día en que la pesca sería buena o no, según los vientos, la estación del año, el clima, los movimientos de los cardúmenes. Si los pesqueros japoneses, con sus barcos-frigoríficos, habían abusado de la pesca, podían prever que se habría sobrepasado el "cupo" y que no valía la pena prender el motorcito y largarse al mar. No obstante, salieron, confiando en sus cálculos.

Esa noche les fue horrible: ¡ni un miserable bagre tuvo la tentación de visitar las redes! Volvieron a la costa y no tuvieron otra alternativa que resignarse a su mala suerte. ¡Con lo cara que está la vida y perdernos así toda una noche de fajina!

Por la mañana, apareció Jesús, fresquito como una lechuga, recién duchado y afeitado. Los discípulos no lo reconocieron de entrada porque, como afirman sesudos teólogos, biblistas y expertos en la materia, después de su resurrección su cara era distinta, cara gloriosa o algo así. Obedecieron al pedido de Jesús: - ¡Tiren las redes...! ¡Esta vez tendrán éxito! ¡Yo entiendo de todo! ¡En mi superconocimiento está la superpesca que ustedes lograrán esta supernoche! Los discipulos le dijeron que estaban cansados, que ya lo habían intentado sin resultado alguno, que debían ir a casa temprano, porque transmitían un partido por "Torneos y Competencias". Pero.... "si tú lo dices", lo haremos.

Aunque Jesús no era pescador de peces, acataron su orden.

¿Resultado? La red "se llenó tanto de peces, que no podían arrastrarla". Luego, hicieron en la costa una flor de cazuela, destaparon un Chablis blanco de la zona y, charlando animosamente, compartieron los frutos del mar, del trabajo del hombre y de la bondad de Dios.

Aun el más inteligente se puede equivocar o fracasar. No te hagas un drama por ello. El que nos parezca menos competente (Jesús no era pescador) puede darnos un buen consejo. Con el "dato" del Señor, la sobreabundancia de los dones de Dios se hizo patente. ¿Necesitas más "moraleja"?






