

He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" Chapter 3 of the book "From Christendom to Apostolic Mission" is titled The Current Climate. We are very clearly moving away from a Christendom culture as we witness how economic, political and social life are no longer inspired by Christian principles. As the influence of Christianity wanes in society we do not lose hope or give over to discouragement. There will be sacrifices in the years to come as the number of practicing Catholics continues to lessen and support for our institutions becomes more challenging. Christ promised, however, that the Church, not Church structures, would endure to the end of time. The Church – this gathering of believers who are moved by Christ – will persist to the end despite any closure of institutions or buildings.

The time we are in demands that we look at how we operate, evangelize and allocate resources as a community of believers. Never grasping at the "golden days" of the past (which weren't always as golden in actuality as they remain in our memory), but facing reality with honesty and hope. God doesn't look at our world and say "shoot, I had all these plans for you as a Church, and now the world is messing them up!". No, the times we live in are always received as they are. We can't help but live in this world as it is and acknowledge the reality of the new challenges we face. This acknowledgement is the prerequisite for hopeful and effective changes in how we can proclaim the Gospel in our community.

Let's be mindful that Christians have endured difficult times throughout our history and that the current times are not so challenging as to think we are worse off than any other era. Though every age faces unique challenges, one thing stays the same: The Gospel's ability to fascinate and attract.

There are still bright spots to pay attention to in today's church. I mentioned last weekend that over 40 O'Gorman Juniors and Seniors chose to be on a three-day retreat hosted at Christ the King. This is promising. Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) is present on three of our campus Newman Centers in our diocese and they do wonderful work with our young people. There are a number of young religious orders that have seen a growth in numbers, including a young woman from Christ the King, Sister Immanuel Fiat Schulte who belongs to the Franciscan Sisters of the Renewal in New York. Also from Christ the King, Brendan Logan entered seminary this year to discern the diocesan priesthood. As a parish I've been so edified by your openness to campus ministry and Fr. Tyler's work at reaching out to the college students in Sioux Falls. These are all places that the Lord is continuing to work in new and exciting ways.

As a parish let's continue to pray (without anxiety or fear, but with confidence and hope) how the Lord will work in the months and years ahead to help us face the unique challenges of our day.
