### **HAVING TROUBLE HEARING THE READINGS & HOMILY?**

We have a solution for you! Just bring a pair of any kind of earbuds and use one of the receivers available in the Sanctuary to hear the Mass. It's that simple! Just plug in your earbuds and adjust the volume. Attach the receiver to your clothing for safekeeping. Be sure to sanitize the receiver before you use it (wipes are available). Lastly, please be sure to return the receiver to the Sanctuary after Mass.

Spring is a upon us, praise the Lord! These months of April and May are so often marked not just by the warming weather, but benchmarks of change and growth: graduations and confirmations, changes of employment and moves. I pray that any planned changes in your life or that of your family can be moments of grace.

Starting something new can rightly be a stressful time. The unknowns, the questions, the uncertainty and the possibility of failure; all these factors contribute to the fear and anxiety that threaten to consume us. At any stage of life, what pulls us out of this paralyzing fear? Is there a path forward when we are not exactly sure what comes next in life? In a world where having so many options can lead us to be fearful of choosing wrongly, what can pull us out of the confusion? I propose to you the need for a companion. Not decision-making techniques, not more prayer time (though you might try that as well!), and not creative ways to flip a coin. A companion who lets us know we are not alone is a crucial factor in alleviating fear and moving forward with life.

A true companion requires us to be vulnerable. It means asking for help or at least expressing a need. It means finding someone who forgives and who is ready to love us in our weakness and mistakes. These people are all around us, but in our heads we find a distance. In our minds no one would love us as readily as we seem willing to love someone in a similar need. The voice of isolation whispers lies to keep us thinking that no one would really want to accompany us in our weakness.

The same isolating voice that keeps from finding a human companionship is the same voice that keeps us from God. The Christian however, is marked by this prevailing awareness that he is not alone, God is with him, God is present. Not always felt, but always sought after, the Christian lives with a certainty of Christ's companionship. Regardless of failure and sin and weakness, this companionship is present to the Christian who is aware of his dependence.

Here is a definition of holiness I found recently: "What the saint craves is not holiness in terms of perfection; it is holiness as encounter, attachment, adhesion, assimilation to Jesus Christ. The encounter with Christ gives the Christian the certainty of a Presence whose force frees us from evil and makes our freedom capable of doing good." This is the kind of holiness I want. Not a command to be perfect of my own willing it, but an adherence to a presence. A companion who loves me through all my crap and is willing to defend me, come to me, love me and forgive me. This is Christ. And it is Christ who accompanies me with a certainty of His presence.

So if you are a graduate, finding a new job, moving towns, or all of the above, find a companion. Don't be isolated in your need and allow fear to overwhelm and paralyze you. This can be as simple as talking to someone intentionally about the conversation that is stuck in your head. And also seek Christ who seeks for you, never allowing your faults and failures weigh you down. This Easter Season may we continue to encounter the merciful love of God that embraces all of us if we repent and believe, confess and seek His face.


