





HAVING TROUBLE HEARING THE READINGS & HOMILY?

We have a solution for you! Just bring a pair of any kind of earbuds and use one of the receivers available in the Sanctuary to hear the Mass. It's that simple! I'm not a huge expert when it comes to movies. Partly because growing up in a small town the nearest movie theater was 30 minutes away...and it had one screen! Movie-going was rare, and options limited. This has perhaps made me more particular with my selections since I want to make sure a film is worth my time before I begin. One that seems to have stood the test of time is "Good Will Hunting" (1997) which I just saw for the first time only last year. Though I highly recommend it, mind you it isn't for children, so don't take this as a recommendation for a family movie night! But a great film nonetheless.

Throughout the movie young Will Hunting (Matt Damon), the genius janitor, finds his potential and discovers the deeper meaning of life. He is assisted by an older psychologist named Sean (played by Robin Williams) who becomes his mentor and friend. The most moving scene for me came when Sean describes to the younger Will the night he met the love of his life. It was Game 6 of the 1975 World Series and as an avid Red Sox fan he had scored some tickets with his friends. Sean describes in detail and with much excitement the epic homer from Carleton Fisk that gave the Red Sox a huge win. After describing this moment, the younger Will and fellow Red Sox fan asks with much excitement "Did you rush the field?", to which Sean responds with surprise, "No...I didn't rush the field, I wasn't there." "What do you mean you weren't there?" Sean replies, "I was in the bar having a drink with my future wife." He had met her in the bar before the game and knew she was the one. Giving up his tickets he spent time getting to know the woman he would marry. As much as he loved baseball, there wasn't any regret about following his heart toward a greater love.

I hope we are attentive to a greater love. We all need a love that pulls us out of our selfishness and self-centeredness. Marriage does this when it is lived well. For me as a priest it doesn't come in the form of a particular woman or in the sacrament of matrimony, but an experience of being loved by Christ and serving people through the sacrament of holy orders. Whatever our vocation in life, I hope the love of God is real for us in concrete ways. Maybe it is annoying to have to sacrifice and give up certain things of the world. But when love draws our hearts out of selfishness, sacrifice can become a joy.


