
**Entrance Antiphon:** O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his influence, alleluia.

May is the month of Mary. We dedicate this entire month to honor Our Lady and you'll notice this weekend the crown of flowers placed on the statues of Mary in our Church here at Christ the King. This is another great reason I love being Catholic! Because the interior relationship we have with God is manifested in outward signs and acts. For instance, the physical kneeling, sitting, standing we do during Mass, the reception of Communion, and the use of Holy Water to remind us of our Baptism; to name just a few, all of these outward gestures are manifestations of an interior reality. The same goes for our devotional practices for the saints. We can silently pray a Hail Mary in our head, but what a gift to also manifest this devotion in physical ways to show our love. We carry rosaries, we have statues, and during this month of May we honor her with an actual crown of flowers.

It is understood that only God deserves our worship, and heaven forbid someone confuse our devotional practices as idol worship. We do not worship statues, nor do sacramentals like rosaries or holy medals serve as superstitious good luck charms. These are rather, reminders of who we belong to, the family of God and communion of Saints with whom we are still connected to in the Body of Christ. Much like we hold pictures of loved ones framed throughout our houses, I hope we likewise remind ourselves of God, Mary and the saints by adorning our homes with statues and holy art.

These outward signs matter and are great ways to grow in our spiritual life. May is a great time to notice the new life all around us and the start of a new season. I pray this month might grow into a new season of renewed devotion to Mary our Mother.


