Happy Mother's day to all of our moms! There is something about this celebration of our mothers that seems so insufficient and disproportionate. Moms give us life, sacrifice and uniquely love us so much for so many years and today we give them a flower or a nice card. It is disproportionate in a way that is almost humorous. I suppose there is no way to properly pay back the gift of life, and every show of gratitude necessarily falls short.

But I think this shows us something of the nature of gratitude. We do not say "thank you" in order to proportionally return what we've received. Gratitude is different than paying back. In no way can any of us do for our moms in the same manner what they have done for us. When we receive a great gift, gratitude isn't enough to declare that now we are even, as if the contract is fulfilled and we can part ways. However, I don't think "being even" is the goal we ought to be aiming for in life, nor is it the goal of gratitude. It may pain us to admit, but we are all in debt. Living in gratitude is a sign that my life is indebted, that my life is a gift. I did not create myself or choose this life. Someone chose it for me; namely, God with the cooperation of my parents. I can't escape this indebtedness and so must constantly live some form of gratitude.

So, get flowers for your mom, give her a nice card, call her, pray for her if she's deceased or you never knew her, and make this small acknowledgement of indebtedness to the one who gave us life.



Are Your Children Misbehaving at Mass?

First of all, we love having kids at mass! Bring them! Even if they are noisy, parents often over-estimate the perceived disruption. Some even apologize to me after Mass, but rarely do I know what they are even talking about because I didn't notice. In my mind, there ought to be a low roar going on because there are so many kids moving, complaining, and crying! It is the sign of a healthy parish and not having you and your children here would be sadness for us all.

There is a threshold I suppose. There is a point where the tantrum has reached fever pitch and you just need to leave the church. Here at Christ the King we don't have a cry room exactly. Families used to go to the attached Community Center with crying children, but the need to space people out has taken precedence and the Community Center is not nearly the refuge it used to be. However, we do have spaces for parents to retreat if needed! First, please feel free to use the bridal room located at the 26th street entryway. It even has a bathroom. You are also welcome to step into the Campus Ministry lounge located at the South entryway.

Bring your children. Use these spaces as you need to. But don't deprive the rest of us of you and your child's presence at Mass!
