



First Reading *Acts 1:1-11*

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for “the promise of the Father about

which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.” When they had gathered together they asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”

This Friday is the last day of the school year for Christ the King! What a year it has been. I'm so happy for our kids to receive their education in person and grateful to Julie Kolbeck and our teaching staff for the good work they've done these past months. It hasn't been without its bumps and bruises, anxieties and tensions, but we did it!

Now for the summer. Did you know that Americans are the worst at taking vacations? There are many reasons for this, and one of them is that we don't have mandated paid vacation days like many industrialized nations. This means some people don't have the option for vacation when they are living pay check to pay check. That's a separate problem than what I mean to talk about here. Stats show that even when we *have* vacation days, Americans stink at actually taking them, often letting them go unused. With this new era of working from home or using technology to work remotely, it is harder than ever to escape the demands of work and enter into rest.

It is good to slow down, to rest and to relax. In fact, it is needed. We live in a world that often makes us feel guilty for taking time off, for 'not pulling our weight', or for simply resting. We must not judge one another's value by how much they produce or by how efficient they are. We must also not judge one another's vacations! How easy it is to compare and then decide for ourselves whether or not they 'deserve' a break. It is weird how our culture both idolizes and demonizes vacation. Advertising and social media makes us think everyone is taking trips to Cancun every other month, while the competitive materialistic/consumer-driven work world says if we don't take our job home with us every day we are being lazy. This combo leads to rampant vacation guilt.

Granted, vacation and relaxation are different than laziness and sloth. Responding generously and competently to the day's work is virtuous. But even the hardest worker will burn out if they deny the human need for rest, relationships, and recreation. These things ought to refresh us and restore us, helping our relationships with one another and strengthening our relationship with God. If a vacation is self-centered it creates tension and wears us down and it isn't a vacation at all.

And this isn't just about vacation. Every week we are called to rest on Sunday. It is a day especially dedicated to the worship of God by attending mass. It is a time for family and prayer. Do we protect this day as a day of rest as we ought? We will be better at vacation if we practice a healthy balance of rest and recreation regularly. Every single day we should have little moments of rest. Traditionally, the angelus bells used to ring out from each church at 6am, noon and 6pm reminding citizens to stop their work and pray for just a moment. It would be a great practice to set an alarm at least twice a day that reminds us to say even some short prayer to the Lord.

Summers are for 'wasting time' with the people we love. Find some time to rest in the Lord today and every day by turning your mind and heart to prayer and be truly refreshed in the Lord! And if you have some vacation days piling up at work, I think you should take them.

Gospel

Mark 16:15-20

Jesus said to his disciples: “Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned.
