HAVING TROUBLE HEARING THE READINGS & HOMILY?

We have a solution for you! Just bring a pair of any kind of earbuds and use one of the receivers available in the Sanctuary to hear the Mass. It's that simple! Just plug in your earbuds and adjust the volume. Attach the receiver to your clothing for safekeeping. Be sure to sanitize the receiver before you use it (wipes are available). Lastly, please be sure to return the receiver to the Sanctuary after Mass.

Happy Pentecost Sunday! This celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit signals the conclusion of Easter. That means it has been 50 days since our celebration of the Lord's Resurrection. I hope it has been a fruitful and joyful season for you. Even though it is the end of the Easter season, you'll notice the next two weekends we will still wear white at Mass instead of the normal green vestments for ordinary time. Pentecost is always followed by two major Sunday Feasts: Trinity Sunday and the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) Sunday.

There is a rich history in the Church that dates back to the Reformation (1500's thereabout) of processing with the Eucharist. It is especially appropriate to process with the Eucharist on this feast of Corpus Christi, which was established as a universal Church celebration in the year 1264. Instead of doing a small procession after each weekend Mass we are going to do one big procession at 1pm on Corpus Christi Sunday June 6th. We will carry the Eucharist in the monstrance from Christ the King to St. Mary parish, singing and praying along the way. This walk is a little over a mile. If you'd like to join us midway feel free to do that as well! All are welcome to join us for this inaugural event hosted by both parishes.

This coming week on Thursday and Friday we celebrate the ordinations of 6 men to holy orders as they give their lives to serve God's people in the Church. Deacon Jacob Doty, Deacon Scott Miller and Deacon Jeff Schulte will be ordained as priests for the Sioux Falls Diocese and Zach Schaeffbauer, Mitchell McLaughlin and Nick Haiar will be ordained as transitional deacons in preparation for their priesthood ordination in 2022. Nick Haiar will be with us here at Christ the King for the summer so please plan to meet to know and welcome him when he arrives in June. This will be great learning ground for him!

Finally, enjoy this Feast of Pentecost. The coming of the Holy Spirit is no small gift. The third person of the Holy Trinity has the power to transform, heal, inspire, save, console and comfort. Let us call upon the Holy Spirit often throughout our day and allow his power more room in our hearts.
