

Greetings, *Christ the King* Parishioners!

Kristine, Nora, and I are blessed to join your parish family and look forward to making many faith-filled memories with you all!

There is much to say – and so little space – so let me start with what brings my family to your parish: *the short answer is Jesus, who is indeed Christ and King!* As I enter my seventh year of university ministry – coming to serve as CTK Campus Minister and High School Outreach Coordinator – I am more convinced than ever that this must be at the heart of my evangelization (sharing the Good News). John the Baptist says it best when he cries out, “He must increase, but I must decrease”. I so much desire to abide deeply with God, trusting that this will bring personal conversion and growth, fan the fire of faith in young people, and breathe new life into our confused world!

I have attended or served many “Saint _____” parishes these last ten years. After letting the seeds of faith blossom at *St. Thomas Aquinas* (University of Nebraska-Lincoln), I headed to *St. John University Parish* (West Virginia University), where I served my first three years as a FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students) Missionary. Next, I travelled west (chasing my now wife) to *St. Francis of Assisi* (Ball state University) in Indiana. I then chased my fiancée further west to Iowa, where I served two years at *St. Catherine of Siena* (Drake University). It is important to note, however, that each of these parish namesakes earned their saintly prefixes only because of their love for and from Jesus Christ. How fitting that as I leave FOCUS after an amazing six years of evangelization – making lifelong disciples and friends along the way – I am led to the parish that bears His Holy Name – *Christ the King* – to reach new college students at Augustana, USF, and around Sioux Falls!

As I enter this new role, I remember my own initial yes to Jesus Christ and His Catholic Church so many years ago in Hartington, Nebraska – where I grew up and graduated high school. Just as a knight swears fealty – or faithfulness – to a king, I remember committing myself to Christ the King at my Confirmation. I was gifted with strong faith that lasted until college despite mixed-faith parents, a lukewarm religious upbringing, and only a handful of Catholics to run with in my graduating class of 28. The story could have ended there – as recent statistics bear that 8/10 students who enter college practicing their Catholic Faith will leave without it – but in my first week in college, I was invited to a FOCUS Bible Study, began attending Thursday Night Masses, and surrounded myself with friends pursuing the faith. When the trials and temptations of college set in – chasing the party lifestyle, perfectionism in my schoolwork, or generally misplacing my identity as a Son of God – Mass, Reconciliation, and prayer were the anchors that held me steady. Jesus was there for me through many storms, and I only wish I would have paid Him more heed throughout. But thankfully, there was no shortage of chances to fall more deeply in love with Him as a missionary, where every day for six years, I got to attend Holy Mass, pray in the sanctuary, and live fellowship with missionary teams, priests, and students!

Father Samson said it well in the hiring process: “You are used to having a missionary team, but Father Tyler and I are hoping we can be your team now!” Though I am no longer surrounded by a team or 500+ young missionaries at training, I remind myself at Sioux Falls Masses that the people of this parish and diocese are my new teammates and missionaries-in-training! Jesus tells us that the harvest is plentiful, after all, so let's band together as laborers for His Kingdom!

In closing, please know I am excited to meet you all and blessed to work with *CTK Campus Ministry* to invite as many students as possible into relationship with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit! I am committed to working with Fathers Samson and Mattson to create a home at the parish – and especially a seat in the sanctuary – for students whose hearts will be restless until they rest in Him. Please pray for me as I work with your amazing priests and student leaders to reach Augustana, USF, and other area colleges for the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He is, after all, King!
