

Hello CTK family,

My name is Deacon Nick Haiar. I grew up in Sioux Falls and went to St. Mary's for elementary school. I attended O'Gorman for Middle and High School. I went to USD for college where I pursued a degree in Biology, because I wanted to become a doctor. While at college, I encountered FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students) Missionaries at the Newman Center. I was invited to a conference in St. Paul over Christmas break of 2011. I had a conversion at that conference where I encountered Christ as a real person. I realized I needed to change my life because I wasn't happy and was ruining relationships.



Through prayer, a retreat, and the right people, I chose to become a missionary for FOCUS instead of becoming an eye doctor. It was during my time in FOCUS that the Lord started to give me the idea of being a priest. Initially, I met the idea with fear and hesitation. However, over time through talking with various priests, prayer, etc. I found myself desiring to go to seminary. I then did a fair amount of discerning and searching as I didn't know if God was calling me to be a diocesan priest like Father Samson, or a religious priest. Eventually, God revealed that he wanted me to be a priest like Fr. Samson, so I applied and was eventually accepted.

I just finished my 5<sup>th</sup> year of seminary and was ordained a deacon on May 27<sup>th</sup> by Bishop DeGrood. I will be at CTK this summer doing various things; preaching, helping with funerals, baptizing, visiting parishioners in their homes, etc. I will return to St. Paul Seminary in Minnesota this Fall for my last year of school. I would then be ordained a priest next May, God willing. I look forward to meeting you and experiencing the community that is here.

I have 2 step brothers and a sister. My sister lives in Sioux Falls with her family. Most of my extended family lives in or near Mitchell, where they are originally from. I enjoy reading history and fantasy books, drawing, exercising, hunting, camping, and fishing. I grew up doing outdoor things with my dad and his side of the family. My favorite color is blue and my favorite food is either steak or hamburgers. My guilty pleasure is ice cream like cookies n' cream or vanilla ice cream with chocolate syrup and some salty nuts. My favorite books are the Lord of the Rings trilogy, and I enjoy a good action movie such as "The Hunt for Red October." I don't watch much sports on TV, but I do enjoy watching a good college football or basketball game.

I hope that I get to meet many of you this summer, and please invite me to your home or a simple restaurant. One of the things I enjoy most about ministry is the blessing of building good relationships and even friendships with people. Now that you know some things about me, I want to get to know you! Know of my prayers for all of you.
