All Christ the King parishioners are invited to attend a parish-wide meeting Wednesday June 23<sup>rd</sup> 6-9pm! This meeting will be facilitated to help us think creatively about the parish, our school and campus ministry. A light meal is provided so we ask for an RSVP by calling or emailing Becca at the office or putting your name on our sign-up sheet in the community center after Mass. Also, stop into the community center and see the work in progress on our flip charts!

In thinking creatively about the parish, a few parameters can guide us. First, location matters. I'm so grateful for the unique position we are in at 26<sup>th</sup> and Lake Ave. Our neighborhood allows us a unique opportunity to reach University students and provide a Catholic education for working families through our school. I'm hopeful that our location might afford us more opportunities to be a refuge for the sick and those who serve the sick. Sanford, the Veterans hospital and Lifescape are all nearby and I hope nurses, doctors, staff, as well as patients of these facilities can find some refuge within the walls of Christ the King parish and school. We also have multiple nursing homes within our parish boundaries that are prime opportunities to accompany the elderly.

Being Catholic we are mindful that we are not an independent organization, disconnected from the wider Church and swayed by the world around us. Praise God we are Catholic! We belong to our diocese, follow our bishop appointed by Pope Francis, and profess an ancient faith handed down through the ages. It is a Church institution filled with humans, yet divinely guided and so all our planning holds an affection for and allegiance to the Church founded by Christ.

The parish is "that community gathered around the Table of the Word and the Eucharist." We believe that the sacraments and the scriptures are central to who we are and we long to share that with those around us. Pope Francis recently said, "Witness is the way to embody the wisdom of Jesus. That is how the world is changed: not by power and might, but by the Beatitudes. Only a life can set life in motion. Let us never forget that Christ is proclaimed above all by the witness of lives transformed by the joy of the Gospel... A living faith in Jesus is 'contagious'; it can change the world." (Pope Francis in Iraq March 5-8, 2021.) As Christians I hope we display to the world around us the 'contagious' nature of a living faith in Jesus. Even our best planning will fall flat if Christ is not at the center.

I'm really hopeful that this meeting can be a time to think big and create a clearer vision of how we bring Christ to the world around us. Everything we do is a chance to witness. Pope Benedict XVI says, "*Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction.*" Our various ministries and organizations within the parish are all opportunities to witness to others the encounter we've had.

Our school and campus ministry are highlighted in this planning process because they are an essential focus for our parish and a big chunk of our resources will go toward these efforts. But all other ministries are also included in this planning - religious education, adult education, marriage and family life, Knights of Columbus, St. Vincent de Paul, respect life, homebound and nursing home ministries, coffee and rolls, funeral luncheons and all the other associations and groups tied to CTK!

I hope we can plan for a bright future here at Christ the King! And we will do so as a people gathered around the Eucharist and God's Word, under the beautiful mission of the Catholic Church, following our Bishop, and witnessing to the encounter we have had with Jesus by a joyfully contagious way of life!

Ok. Let's plan and see where the Lord leads us!
