

Weekend Offering December 25-26th, 2021



Christmas was Last Saturday ... we received our Messiah, but in a manner that we did not expect ... and so some of us received the "Season," but did not receive our Messiah in person in our hearts. Christmas was not just a week ago ... it is NOW! We have a second chance to receive our Lord and Savior if we can reset our hearts to do so. Last Sunday we were also given the Holy Family ... Jesus, Mary and Joseph (J+M+J) ... to show us the importance of the family as the smallest unit of the Catholic Church, a family that we can closely associate with. On the first of this year we also received Our Mother Mary. We are no longer outcasts in the world, but we now have a family ... the family of the Church, the Body of Christ, but also membership in the family of heaven and with the Holy Family ... Mary is our Mother! So much Joy awaits us, so much Joy is experienced Now! With more to come. We celebrate Christmas not on one day alone but for an OCTAVE (that's Eight days). We also celebrate the "Season of Christmas" until the Baptism of the Lord on the 9th of January. So, you see, we are still celebrating Christmas. If you took down your tree, put it back up!

We Catholics are Christians, but we are strange Christians. Even though we celebrate Christmas as a time of Joy, we also recognize it as a time of sacrifice and suffering. As Catholics we are not "either/or" but we are "both/and" ... we combine, and quite naturally so, Joy and Suffering, Life and Death. In fact, we recognize "death" as a new life, a new beginning in the Joy of joining God in heaven. Death is not the end, it is not something to be feared, but something to be embraced and we celebrate that even during the joy of Christmas ... even during the Octave of Christmas.

We celebrate Christmas, the nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ on the 25th of December, but we also celebrate the martyrdom of St. Stephen (one of the first seven deacons of the Church) on the 26th (when it is not on Sunday as it is this year) our First Saint and Martyr. We also celebrate the martyrdom of the Holy Innocents on the 28th and the martyrdom of St. Thomas Beckett on the 29th. Just as we rejoice and mourn at once, in the Birth and in the Passion of Our Lord; so we both rejoice and mourn in the death of martyrs. We mourn for the sins of the world that has martyred them; and we rejoice, that another soul is numbered among the Saints in Heaven.

That is why it is so fitting that we celebrate these martyrs around Christmas. Christ who was of heaven was born on earth so that those of the earth might be able to be born into heaven. Again: Christ was born to die so that those who unite their death to His might be born again into eternal life. Life and death. We must have death to have new life. This creation must end to have the joy of the new creation.

This Sunday we celebrate the Epiphany. We recognize the public recognition of Jesus as Lord and Savior, but by way, also, of recognizing His suffering and death to come through the gifts of the Magi as they visit the Christ Child ... Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. Gold to recognize the new King, royalty. Frankincense to recognize Jesus' Godhead. But Myrrh to shadow His death to come. Joy and death are celebrated by Catholics almost equally ... there should be no fear of either in our worship, but an expectation of both to come and yet both are always present. We are a people whose lives are an Alleluia ... we are a people who wrap death with our joy.


