

# Weekend Offering January 1-2nd, 2022



 It is hard to believe how much time has passed since the last bulletin article I wrote for Christ the King Parish! At that point, my wife, daughter, and I were just moving into town and I was just starting to meet college students from nearby universities. But here we are again, seven months later, and a lot has changed! I am overjoyed to be evangelizing the thousands of college students in Sioux Falls in and with this parish – alongside Father Tyler, Father Samson, and our amazing student leaders! In addition to the attached update, it is a blessing to share with you just a few more fruits of CTK Campus Ministry.

Over this past semester, we have been in regular contact (via email, text, and social media) with over 200 students from Augustana, USF, Southeast, etc. It took a lot of catching students after Mass, going out onto different campuses, text messaging, and invitations, but nearly 100 of those students are new from this past semester alone. On a regular weekend when school is in session, we are averaging around 65-85 students at our Masses – with the vast majority attending the beloved 7 PM Student Mass! Father Tyler and I have personally met up with more than 50 students (ranging from Cradle Catholics, to Converts, to Protestants, to Seekers, to Doubters) in 1:1 or small group settings to grow in friendship, discuss virtue, learn catechesis, pray together, and take steps to give our lives over to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. These conversations often take place over lunches on campus or nearby restaurants, walks or sporting activities, or in our newly refurbished student lounge. The hope is always to make invitations into the next step for any particular student: this could mean joining a small group, attending a retreat, increasing time in prayer, renouncing a certain sin, joining RCIA to become Catholic, or travelling with us for a conference or mission trip!

We have had around 50 students show up for our Wednesday night Bible study (a highlight for many), with an average of 20-30 guys and girls each study. Most recently, it has been awesome to see students trek in all the way from Southeast Technical College! What started as one student turned into invitations that led to five and counting!

Yes, God is certainly bearing much fruit in these conversations, adventures, retreats, studies, and meals! I could go on for paragraphs and pages, but it is perhaps better to end with words of different students who recently applied for our Student Board:

"After I went to one Bible study, I fell in love with it and want to be a bigger part of the campus ministry. I also think this is a great way for me to build lifelong friendships and bonds which I need being so far from home."

"I feel like campus ministry at CTK has really helped me strengthen my bond with Jesus. I would like to help CTK to have the same impact on other college students and find ways to encourage them to get more involved."

"Some of my most incredible/faith-filled relationships have arisen and grown through this Bible study. I hope to assist CTK in providing the same welcoming, challenging, vulnerable, and positive environment for generations of students for years to come."

"Finding CTK Campus Ministry helped me greatly by showing me how many of my peers are Catholic and how important relationships with them could be. Finding a group of people who love the Lord just as much as I do is absolutely incredible. Every week, I look forward to Wednesday night Bible study, for it is always the break I didn't know I needed. With this being said, I would love to contribute to the Catholic home that you all have built."

Thank you, parishioners of Christ the King, for all you have done to make this fruitful ministry a reality! Your prayers, financial gifts, friendly smiles, and any other sacrifices you have made do not go unnoticed! Be great saints and know of our prayers!


