 Sunday the 16<sup>th</sup> (today, if you are reading this at Sunday Mass) will be the third annual "Last Collar Standing" put on the by our diocese. Priests (myself and Fr. Tyler included) will be competing online doing trivia, games and using strategy to survive and not get voted off the game. I was involved in the first series and I was surprised how many people actually watched it. And not only watched it, but stuck it out for 3 hours! They are promising to keep it at 2 hours this time. We will host a watch party in the community center here at Christ the King if you'd like to enjoy some popcorn and watch it on the big screen. Or you can find it online at home and watch it in the comfort of your own house.

As I said above, I'm always surprised that people enjoy this show! This show highlights priests interacting as brothers with humor and revealing personal interests and abilities. For instance, on this show we priests will likely reveal our level of knowledge of pop-culture, our indifference or expertise in sports, or our frustration with technology as we navigate the zoom call.

There is something about the humanity of the priest that can still surprise us. In a positive light, this reveals a great respect for priests and their sacred role as a sacramental minister and spiritual father. But our surprise at the humanity of a priest might also be an idealization of who God calls to this role. I know as a child I kind of just thought priests fell out of the sky. And then I became one, and it was very clear to me, there was no descending from on high during my path to ordination. It is a high calling, and it is a calling meant for human men from our own human families right here at Christ the King and within our diocese.

You may have noticed that each Sunday we alternate between praying for vocations and praying for families. I love the first line in our prayer for families that reads, "We bless your name, O Lord for sending your Son Jesus to be born of Mary to become part of a human family, so that, as he lived and grew, he would experience the sorrows and joys of family life." Jesus chose to become part of a human family, just as our priests come from human families.

Finally, one of the spiritual fathers in my life has been Fr. Luigi Giussani. He said,

"To be a good priest, you must, above all else, be from among men. If you are men, feel in yourself those things that are proper to men, the needs and problems typical of men; live the relationship with everything which become present. Live the truth of your humanity. Cry because you need to cry - or you are afraid, because the problem is difficult and you feel the inadequacy of your strength. Be human; live your humanity as an inspiration, as a sensitivity to the problems, as a risk to face, as a faithfulness to what God makes urgent in your soul. In this way, reality will appear to your eyes in a true way.

The reality of our humanity is not to be shunned or stuffed for the sake of being "spiritual", but rather lived to its fullness. Pray for priests and religious. They come from our families. Let's live the drama of these times with an openness to Christ, always welcoming him into our families, our homes and our hearts that he would bring about a good in

every circumstance. And may we all see the path of holiness we are called to today.


Bring your children. Use these spaces as you need to. But don't deprive the rest of us of you and your child's presence at Mass!
