# So My Soul Is Thirsting



She sings with an exuberance and naivete which could only be born in the heart of a child. I watch her each Sunday as she finds a spot as close to the choir as possible. Her family files in after her. She seems undisturbed by younger siblings who do not have the same wonder and enthusiasm for Mass singing as she does. They poke and prod, crawl past her in quick escape from an occasional slip of parental

supervision. It doesn't bother or deter her.

On this late Advent Sunday I catch her eye as she sings the psalm response from memory. She smiles but does not stop singing...As the deer that longs for running water, so my soul is thirsting, so my soul is thirsting for my God. I wonder if she understands the ache which prompted the psalmist so many centuries ago to put these words to music. I wonder if she could possibly realize all the anguish my friend Mike put into these words and music as he wrote them at a time when composition came to him with uninspired difficulty and grim determination; when God—as God often seems to some of us—is a theoretical proposition rather than comforting companion....so my soul is thirsting, so my soul is thirsting....

I smile and nod to her. I mean to be encouraging not just of her singing but of that particular yearning we humans seem to have for a God whose rumored love came once in swaddling clothes...so my soul is thirsting, so my soul is thirsting...She sings more loudly, a fact which annoys her younger brother. He clamps his hands over his ears and shakes his head. He knows I am watching. I lift my eyebrows and cock my head side-wise with a small grimace. He laughs. It is all a game to him. I wonder, and hope at the same time, when it will dawn on him that whether there is a God who loves us or not, and whether we believe in that God or not really does change everything. He is young and there is time for this realization—but not so much...so my soul is thirsting, so my soul is thirsting for God which first tells us that believing in God, loving God, does not come easily and without cost and exists in us only because we have hearts which are meant to be broken. Hearts which have never been broken will never understand Christmas...so my soul is thirsting, so my soul is thirsting for you my God...GRS.

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. • We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. • Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. • For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. • I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.



Contact the Parish Office to make an appointment with the pastor.


## MINISTRY TO THE SICK


