Well, it has finally come, my retirement. A priest I knew in Eau Claire, actually a very holy and good man knew how many confessions, baptisms, weddings he'd witnessed. No kidding. He kept a diary and tallied up the numbers every week. In the confessional he had a clicker that counted off the number of confessions he'd heard. When we had penance services throughout the city, he'd secretly keep the clicker in his pocket. No one knew he was counting, counting. He truly was a holy man. His last days however were spent in delirium and I wondered when I went to see him if all the faces of his confessions, baptisms, weddings were dancing in his head as he slowly made his way back to God.

Not me though. The only number I have solidly in my head is 43. That's how many years I've been ordained. I worked for the Diocese of La Crosse before I was ordained though so it's really closer to 50 that I've been working for the Church. It is time for me to go though, the fullness of time.

Last week I got the official letter from the bishop accepting my resignation from St. Joe's and granting me status as a Senior Priest. They really want Senior Priests to keep working but I think I've put in my time. Three parishes all together. St Patrick's and Newman in Eau Claire, and St. Joseph's in Prescott. I can now let out a secret about my coming to St. Joe's. I always knew I would wind up here. Just knew it. When my father was alive he'd ask me where I was going and I would say Prescott. He'd scoff, "That's too far away," he say. He was right of course but then again he never moved more than ten miles from where he was born.

Thank you to all the good people of St. Joe's for making me feel welcome these past 8 years. I know I wasn't all I was supposed to be for some of you. I really have no skill set with small children. And, I know for some of you I was too much. A few of you left the parish

because of me--and I'm sorry about that. But for the most part you accepted me, made me feel welcome and useful. I guess that was always my final hope as a priest--that I

be useful. Not for all, but for some, I was useful. For Jesus and the Church, I was useful--not the greatest, not the worst, but useful. Thank you...GRS

On a side note, the Diocese informed me a couple of weeks ago that the new pastor would not arrive in Prescott until July and basically I am not allowed to say who is it. If the guy who I think will come here comes here you will love him. He's an easier guy to love than me.

For the next 7 months or so there will be fill-in priests. I even have two weekends--the last in January and the last in March. Most of the weekends however will be covered by Fr. Corradi. He likes it here and you were always kind to him.

Christmas break begins for the school on December 23rd and will run through January 2nd. School will resume on Monday, January 3rd. The school office will be closed these dates as well.




