

# A message from Fr. David~

First, a bit about daily Mass and then a little more about myself.

One of the biggest goals of any parish priest and pastor is to increase the awareness about the necessity for all Catholics to love the Mass and the Eucharist and to "come to Him." I believe there is enough weariness, depression, and chaos in our world to make a case for the absolute need to "come to Him" at Mass and allow Jesus to "come to us" in the Eucharist. The daily Mass is the only thing that stays the "hand of God" from exhibiting His wrath and justice against the evil in the world. It is the love of God which is shown to us every day, at every daily Mass, in every corner of the world. When Jesus comes down upon His altar and offers His body and soul and Divinity as a sacrifice for sinners and as an offering of mercy. This is the reality of a spiritual world of grace that stems the tide against Satan, sin, and temptation. The daily Mass builds us up with the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. It inspires us to be strong and filled with wisdom and it nourishes our souls to go out and "spread the Kingdom" to the world by our words and actions. We need more disciples who understand this, take it seriously, and follow through. I will continue for a while to belabor more important points in future columns about the daily Mass and hope that you respond to my encouragement and shared knowledge to "come to Him" at the daily Mass.

Although the priesthood is my life, I do have other interests to balance my life a bit. I am a deer hunter. More of a "cowboy" than an "Indian" as I shoot rifle, not bow. I do like to fish, but don't have a boat, so I don't get out there much, if at all. I used to be on the order of a bigger fisherman, going to Canada to fish, including up into the Flin Flon where I caught a 31 ½" inch Walleye. By His Grace! Interesting that on that trip Fr. Ryan Moravitz was with me and a very young Fr. Drew Braun (who is my first cousin) was in the boat too (both were seminarians). In those days I had the perfect rig for what we were doing up there, but I have since sold my boat. Too busy and getting old.

Trapping was a thing, too, for a while. I have trapped a Grey Fox, a Red Fox, a Coyote, and two Ermine. These I have taxidermied along with that Walleye I spoke of earlier, a good sized Crappie, a Woodchuck, a Muskrat, a Bobcat, and a Buck. All that's left on my list of animals that I want to taxidermy is a large Northern Pike and a Black Bear.

I get excited for doing some of this, but it doesn't consume me. You know how the experiences you've had spoil the ones in the present and future? It's kind of like that. I'm grateful for the things I have been able to do in the past and it does temper my desire to do more of the same kind of thing. I do like spear-fishing. I have not been real successful with it. I keep trying, though, and will try again this winter.

I like watching movies and some things on Netflix. I read only spiritual books. I can play and sing with the guitar. However, my ability to play the guitar is hampered by a broomball accident I had in '92 at college. I had a compound fracture of my left index finger bone which means I can't play bass chords or hold all the strings down at once.

I have many tools for doing many projects around here and at my mom and sister's place. I like working on things, seeing projects completed, and enjoying my handiwork. All these things take a back seat on the bus of my life to my priesthood... even eating.
