20th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus said to his disciples: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" - Lk 12:49 The Rosary is a very important part of my prayer and devotional life. I try to inspire and lead others to find in the Blessed Virgin Mary a true Mother, faithful, pure (undefiled), Immaculate and holy. Mary has been allowed by Her Son Jesus to continue the work of the Gospel in the world. Of particular importance are the apparitions of Mary at Guadalupe, Lourdes, and Fatima but there are hundreds of other apparitions (some approved some not approved or recognized by the Church). There is a wonderful book that chronicles every alleged, approved or disapproved Marian Apparition from the Fatima Apparition to today throughout the world. It is called <u>The World of Marian Apparitions</u> by Wincenty Laszewski.

Mary always implores us to pray the Rosary and to make reparation for sin in her apparitions. She is concerned for Her children. We are losing the way, the truth and the life. We are losing sight of Her Son and Jesus' love for the Father. She desperately wants to bring us back to the Holy Trinity and to the Church, "to Jesus through Mary" and the Rosary and acts of reparation accomplish these things.

When I preside at daily Mass, I always lead a Rosary. Usually once a day at the rectory, I pray a Rosary. Sometimes if a can't sleep I will repeat over and over the Hail Mary or the Memorare Prayer. My favorite time to lead or participate in the Rosary is with small children. Sometimes with kids a full Rosary is hard, but a decade is always doable. Little kids need to have the mysteries of the Rosary explained to them and adults need to be able to know (what day has what mystery during the week and what the mysteries are on that day). This is important because the Rosary is a prayer of meditation and you need to be able to sink into the moment of the mystery and participate in silent moments of love. So first for those who don't know the mysteries or the days they are attributed to, the following:

Sunday and Wednesday Monday and Saturday Tuesday and Friday Thursday The Glorious Mysteries The Joyful Mysteries The Sorrowful Mysteries The Luminous Mysteries

Next what the titles of each mystery of the decade are:

The Glorious Mysteries: Resurrection; Ascension; Descent of the Holy Spirit; Assumption; Coronation

The Joyful Mysteries: The Annunciation; The Visitation; The Nativity; The Presentation; The Finding of the Boy Jesus in the Temple

The Sorrowful Mysteries: The Agony in the Garden; The Scourging at the Pillar; The Crowning with Thorns; The Carrying of the Heavy Cross; The Crucifixion

The Luminous Mysteries: The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan; The Manifestation of Jesus and the Wedding at Cana; The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God; The Transfiguration; The Institution of the Eucharist.

I'm going to write about how to meditate with the rosary next time and not just "say" the rosary but "pray" the rosary. More to come...
