
#### **ANNUAL KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FREE THROW COMPETITION SET**

#### The Journey of "Syndality"

Over the next year in response to an invitation to



every diocese from Pope Francis to help prepare for the next synod (a meeting of a group of bishops with the pope) in 2023.

Every diocese in the world is invited by our Holy Father to conduct a broad conversation. The

basic task of our diocesan participation in the worldwide synod is simply to gather together in our local communities with as many people as possible and ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with his love and give us wisdom, understanding and right judgment. As we go through the process, we will prayerfully reflect and visit with one another about how best to grow together as a spiritual family, the family of God in our homes, our parishes, our communities and as a diocese. Synod meetings are scheduled for:

Montrose, St. Patrick, Saturday, February 12, 6:00 pm with a meal and meeting Salem, St. Mary, Saturday, February 19, 6:00 pm with a meal and meeting. \*\*ALL PARISHIONERS ARE INVITED AND ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND.\*\*

A diocese survey will be coming out in February to fill out. An online sample survey will also be available.

**"SYNOD**" is not a familiar word. What does it mean? A great biblical point of reference for the reality of a synod is found in the Gospel of Luke (Luke 24:13-35). Cleopas and another disciple are walking together seven miles from Jerusalem to Emmaus on the day of the resurrection. As they walked "they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them" (Luke 24:14-15).

Later in the encounter, after the disciples had recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread, they recounted, "Were not our hearts burning within us as he spoke to us on the way?" (Luke 24:32). Walking together, discussing, welcoming and recognizing Jesus, who is present with us, letting him speak to our hearts and set them afire, these are the essential elements of the reality we call a "synod" in the Church.
